August 24, 1928-September 30, 2016

Bill, the little boy born to Pete and Wilma Dick in 1928 who grew into a respected rancher and Round-Up volunteer, passed away.

Bill's early years were spent at Alkali Grade School. At Pilot Rock Jr. High a girl named Beverly captured his heart and in 1947 his dream came true as they were married on March 20, 1949. His time at Pilot Rock High School saw Bill become the first pitcher to throw a no-hitter.

After working on several farms in the Pilot Rock area, Bill joined the Army. During his time of service, January 1952 until December 1960, Cpl. Dick was awarded the Army Occupational Medal (Germany) and the National Defense Service Medal.

Bill owned a Chevron service station for a time but he decided ranching was the life he wanted for himself and his wife Beverly. He was the foreman for Rugg Ranches for 13 years when the opportunity to lease wheat ground was found in Pilot Rock. In time Bill started his own beef cattle herd. The Quarter Circle D Ranch of Pendleton being the family ranch he had wanted. The family worked the ranch from 1980 until retirement in 1997.

Bill belonged to the Wheat League and the Cattlemen's organization. He also enjoyed working with his children with their 4-H animals.

He was also an elder at the First Presbyterian Church of Pendleton. Bill was a very active volunteer for the Pendleton Round-Up, serving 50 years including being a director from 1977 to 1984. Bill and Beverly were part of the Pendleton Elks Roving RV Club.

After Beverly's death, Bill moved into SunRidge Retirement where he met new friends and enjoyed their company. He passed away at SunRidge Adult Care Center.

Steve Lund Sr. Ph.D

Dr. Steve Lund Sr., Pendleton, Ore., passed away peacefully in his sleep Saturday, October 1, just short of his 93rd birthday. He was born in Exeland, Wis., on December 3, 1923, as the sixth boy to Annie Bell McHenry Lund and Robert Lund. He graduated from high school in Ladysmith, Wis., and joined the army in 1942.

He served as an infantryman during WWII with the 34th Division of the U.S. Army in Italy. He was a sergeant at the time of his discharge. He met Gracemary Bernskoetter in Jefferson City, Mo., during the war. They married on January 29, 1946, in Washington, D.C.

After leaving the service, Steve used the GI Bill to get his BS degree in agronomy at Clemson University, S.C. He preceded to attain his M.S. and Ph.D. in plant breeding and plant pathology at the University of Wisconsin in 1953.

His first academic position was at Clemson University as assistant professor before being recruited by Rutgers University. He took a position at Rutgers in N.J. where he developed Norline winter oats, Early Wong barley and Tschermak maling barley. He held the Soils and Crops Department chairmanship at Cook College, Rutgers University for the four years prior to his retirement in 1975 as Professor Emeritus. He was N.J. Boy Scout Commissioner

as well as the director of the N.J. State Shade Tree Commission. He then accepted a research position as a superintendent of the Oregon State University Columbia Basin Research Center where he worked for 10 years before retiring a second time at age 61 years from OSU with a second Professor Emeritus.

He was active in Rotary. In retirement he enjoyed friends, golfing, cross-country skiing, travel, crosswords and duplicate bridge in which he was a Bridge Master. In 2015 he visited the WWII Memorial with the Honor Flight.

He is survived by his lovely wife, Grace, of 70+ years of marriage and his five children, Dr. Steve Lund Jr. (Libby), John Lund (Sharyl), Thomas Lund, Dr. Cynthia Lund (Emile Gaiera) and Lisa Sharkey (Wm Patrick). His grandchildren include Stephanie Lund, Kt Sharkey, Patrick Sharkey (Andrea), Celeste Gaiera, John Paul Sharkey and Hunter Lund, and great-grandchild, Lucia Sharkey.

He is predeceased by his parents and his six brothers, Glen, Dale, Ed Bob, Carl and Max. He was also predeceased by his eldest daughter, Sharon Ann.

Pendleton resident Nyettia Kelly died in her home September 29, 2016. She was 78 years old.

Nyettia was born August 22, 1938, at St. Anthony's hospital in Pendleton to Ira and Mabel Dumont. Shortly after the family moved to Myrtle Creek, Oregon, where Nyettia graduated from Myrtle Creek High School in 1958. As a child Nyettia loved animals, particularly horses, and was an accomplished rider. She also loved to sing, entertaining family and friends singing opera and yodeling, and was a member of her high school Glee Club, choir, and active on the rally squad.

Nyettia liked to fish with her dad, dance, attend parties, and is remembered by classmates and family for her spunk, sense of humor and beautiful smile.

Nyettia met David Kelly in 1960 at a dance in Myrtle Creek where David, recently discharged from the Navy, was working on a road construction crew. They married in 1961 and made their home in Myrtle Creek where Nyettia worked as a nurse's aide at Roseburg Community Hospital. Nyettia and David had three daughters, Nyasa, Kimbra and Dalaine, before moving to Moses Lake in 1969 so David could study aircraft mechanics at Big Bend Community College.

The family moved to Pendleton in 1973 when David accepted a position at Pendleton Air-Motive. On summer weekends Nyettia, David and their daughters would fill their 1954 Chevy pickup with friends, family members and camping gear and head to the mountains to camp at Indian Lake or the Umatilla Forks campground where they would swim, fish and play games around camp. Everyone was welcome and good

memories were had by all. Nyettia worked 27 years at Delemarter's Nursing Home in Pendleton, many of those years as the activities director, before retiring in 2007. During this time Nyettia was well known for her award-winning Round-Up parade floats; festive holiday decorations; her dog Trigger, a long-time companion to Nyettia and the residents at Delemarter's; and for her care of and affection for the residents with whom she worked.

Nyettia was an avid sports fan throughout her life and in retirement could often be found playing solitaire and watching whatever sport was in season, but spending time with family was her highest priority. Nyettia remained close to her brother and sisters throughout her life and could always be counted on to be there for her daughters, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews, and other family members, sharing a combination of advice, humor, loyalty, and love.

Nyettia touched many in her life and will be missed by all who knew her. A graveside memorial service for family and friends will be held Thursday, October 6, at 10:00 a.m. at Olney Cemetery in Pendleton. Donations can be made to the Pendleton Animal Welfare Shelter (PAWS).
