And on the boys side, Eduardo Corona, Kobe Carillo, Carlos Epifanio, and Juan Salazar were each named to first team, and Ricardo Flores, Alex Delgado and goalkeeper Humberto Villagomez were all named to the second team.

VOLLEYBALL

The Mac-Hi Pioneers ended the volleyball season with a disappointing 1-12 record and an 0-6 mark in the Greater Oregon League to finish fourth. One area the Pioneers did succeed at was in the classroom as head coach Amanda Nelson's squad put together a 3.52 collective GPA, the best mark in the GOL and 13th place in the state rankings.

On top of that, two of Mac-Hi's seniors were recognized by the GOL for their on-court contributions as outside hitter Brooke Smiley and setter Delaney Karrels were named to the all-league second team this week. Karrels also took home the team MVP award this season.

FOOTBALL

The Greater Oregon League also released its all-league football rosters this week, and six Mac-Hi Pioneer players occupied seven second team spots.

Seniors Donnie Clark (DL), Riley Chester (DB), Kaden Kilburg (RB), juniors Allen Mendoza (DB), Spencer Wells (OL), and sophomore Sam Carlson (LB/P) were the Pioneer selections. La Grande quarterback Andrew Peasley was named the conference's Offensive Player of the Year, Ontario's Marcus Delgado was named the defensive Player of the Year.

Mac-Hi also held its team postseason banquet recently and several players were recognized with team awards. Chester took home three team awards, as the senior was named the Offensive MVP, Team MVP, and was the first recipient of the Merle Hufford Game Changer Award

Also taking home awards were Clark (Most Inspirational), Kyler Kelly (Most Improved), Michael Breeding (Defensive MVP), and Drew Birdwell (Tom Doud Best Tackler).

The Timberwolves are young, though, and return just two sophomores from a team that went 5-9 in East region play for a sixth-place finish.

"We've looked really good at times, and then we've made those youthful mistakes," Driver said. "Some of those passes that they got away with at the high school level they're not getting away with."

The T-Wolves' sophomores are guards Erin Ramsey and Brook Haringa, who each saw plenty of minutes as freshmen.

A starter, Ramsey averaged 9.2 points a game and made 34 3-pointers as a 36-percent shooter beyond the arc. She also averaged 3.2 rebounds and 1.2 steals in 30 minutes a game.

Haringa averaged seven points and 2.4 rebounds in 18 minutes a game.

Driver said both appear

comfortable in their new leadership roles, but they won't be asked to carry the team.

"They've been a lot more vocal this year than they were last year, definitely," he said. "We have some pretty vocal freshmen as well, so it's been a nice mix."

"We're all really easily self-taught, but coming together we're a really good team together," Haringa said. "Us sophomores don't really have to get on them much, they know what to do."

The T-Wolves have added seven freshmen to give them a short bench with just nine total, but have brought a little height in as forwards Sydney Wammock (6-foot-1) and Miah Slater (6-0) are the tallest players Driver has had in his three seasons as head coach.

Last season forward Savannah Heugly (5-11) averaged 21 points a game, but did most of her damage facing the rim.

"It's nice to be able to use our

inside a little bit as well as out outsides," said Haringa. "I think we have a lot more speed on the team and I think we have a lot better ball movement and better talk. We're working well together."

The T-Wolves will still struggle to match up with the bigger teams in their league, though, and will rely on smart passing to get the ball to the open shooter.

At the center of those efforts is freshman point guard Akira McGee from San Jose, California.

"On the offensive end the ball movement has been great," Driver said. "They're making that extra pass to get a better look at the hoop, so that's been phenomenal."

McGee said her prime goal at the moment is finishing at the hoop so she can help the team improve on its 67.1 points of offense per game from last season, but mostly she and the T-Wolves are just eager to get the season started.

"I'm always excited for the first

game," she said. "We get to see how we're doing, and we get to beat people. I like beating people, it's fun."

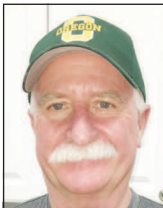

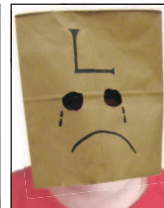
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
