Bulldogs place third at Oregon City

OREGON CITY — The Hermiston Bulldogs wrestling team got a good start to its 2016-17 season on Saturday with a third place finish at the Tyrone S. Woods Memorial Tournament.

The Bulldogs scored 209.5 points with 16 competitors for its finish, coming in only behind No. 2 Beaverton (230 points, 24 wrestlers) and No. 1 North Medford (263.5 points, 27 wrestlers). Hermiston earned nine top-five finishes at the meet, led by champions Ruben Madrigal (106 pounds), CJ Hendon (145 pounds) and Joey Gutierrez (182 pounds).

Rounding out the top finishers were Alice Todryk No. 3 at 106 pounds, Augusta Blackhurst No. 4 at 113 pounds, Gage Shipley No. 3 at 120 pounds, Jesus Rodriguez No. 3 at 132 pounds, Julio Leiva No. 3 at 182 pounds and Beau Blake No. 2 at 285 pounds.

Mountaineers’ dream season ends

BALDWIN CITY, Kan. — The No. 9 EOU football team once again took to the road Saturday afternoon, this time to take on second-ranked Baker in the NAIA FCS Semifinals. The Blue and Gold gave the Wildcats all they could handle but ultimately came up short, 45-41 inside historic Liston Stadium.

The wild, high-scoring game wasn’t what many fans expected, as fans from both sides expected a defensive nail-bitter but instead got an offensive thriller. However, it was the Wildcats who seemed to have a little more juice than the Mountaineers, scoring the game-winning touchdown on a 77-yard pass with under a

minute to play.

Despite the heartbreaking loss, the 2016 campaign is one the Mounties should be proud to hang their helmets on. In August, the Frontier Conference Preseason Coaches’ Poll tabbed the Mountaineers to finish fourth in the Frontier Conference. Fast-forward almost exactly four months and EOU made history, finishing as one of the final four members of the NAIA FCS Semifinals.

Senior quarterback Zach Bartlow threw 21 completions for 202 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions while scampering for 61 rushing yards.

Senior wideout TJ Esekiele grabbed seven receptions for



68 yards while junior wideout Brenden Kelly nabbed six passes for 69 yards and two touchdowns as the duo led the way for the EOU receiving game.

For the EOU running game, senior running back Alfred Gross ran for 137 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, EOU forced four turnovers including two interceptions for senior defensive back Jesus Retano who also made two tackles in route to being named Defensive Player of the Game. Justin Hughes also got involved in the interceptions, as the junior defensive back grabbed one interception before returning it 23 yards.

Junior linebacker Michal

Arenas took down 10 total tackles including eight unassisted for a team-high. Senior defensive back Kalliy Ceesay wasn’t far behind, finishing with 6 unassisted tackles.

In EOU’s third playoff game ever and first FCS Semifinals appearance ever, the Blue and Gold found themselves on the board first, forcing a quick three-and-out on Baker’s first possession. Bartlow found Kelly along the Baker sideline as the wide receiver took it to the house on a 23-yard pass completion.

Baker would answer the Mountaineers score with a 29-yard pass completion for a touchdown between Wildcat quarterback Logan Brettell and wide receiver Damon Nolan, who’d go on to catch two more touchdowns for 217 yards while being named Offensive Player of the Game.

Dwyane Wade scored 34 points for the Bulls, and Jimmy Butler finished with 26 points, seven rebounds and five assists. Robin Lopez had seven points and a season-high 14 rebounds.

Chicago played without point guard Rajon Rondo, suspended one game for conduct detrimental to the team. There was no public indication from the Bulls on what triggered Rondo’s suspension. He is expected to return Tuesday night in Detroit.

“He’s obviously very important with what we do in this building,” coach Fred Hoiberg said. “He’s a guy that really gets us out and establishes the tempo for our team, especially in the fourth quarter. He’s important for what we do, but that’s not the reason we lost the game.”

Portland trailed 93-92 before Ed Davis converted a driving layup with 8:19 left, sparking an 11-0 run for the Trail Blazers. Turner made three straight jumpers and Lillard connected from long range to make it 103-93 with 5:55 left.

“We used a lot of energy coming back in the third quarter and then from there we didn’t make enough shots,”

Wade said.

Mirotic finished with 18 points and seven rebounds for the Bulls, who have dropped three of four. Isaiah Canaan had 10 points.

Lillard scored 17 to help Portland to a 65-57 halftime lead. The Trail Blazers shot 55 percent in the first half, but the Bulls turned it up on defense to get back in the game in the third quarter.

Mirotic capped an 18-4 run with two foul shots, giving Chicago a 75-70 lead with 5:44 left. The Bulls had an 87-83 advantage before McCollum made a 3-pointer in the final second of the period, trimming the lead to one heading into the final quarter.

AMINU’S RETURN

Portland forward Al-Farouq Aminu had three points in 17 minutes in his return to the lineup after being sidelined by a left calf injury. Aminu started the first eight games of the season before he got hurt Nov. 8 against Phoenix.

“You could tell he had a little rust, but it was good to see him back on the court,” Stotts said.

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
