Hermiston High School students honored for tech achievements

Three Hermiston High School students are the local winners of the 2016 Congressional App Challenge — a contest hosted by several congressional districts that encouraged students nationwide to create original apps.

Senior Jordan Liebe, junior Marvin Hozi and sophomore Courtney Cash developed "Touch and Talk," an app that will give students a new way to communicate their needs nonverbally.

The students, with the help of computer science teacher Robert Theriault, developed the app to help the Hermiston School District special programs department provide its students with more forms of nonverbal communication. The app will allow students to communicate simple phrases, such as requesting a pencil, selecting numbered or lettered options or

answering true/false questions. Users can select answers using a touchscreen, a mouse, a space bar or arrow keys, as well as an electrical conductor button known as a "Makey-Makey." The program allows students to choose their "voice," which corresponds with their gender.

The students created a video demonstrating how the app works that can be found on YouTube. The students said in the future they hope to customize the app even more.

Thousands of students learned to code over the past few months as part of a nationwide competition, to which more than 650 original apps were submitted. The Hermiston High School students, along with other students from around the U.S., have been invited to show their apps to members of Congress and the tech community at an event in Washington, D.C., in April 2017.

Richard E. "Dick" "Andy" Anderson of Vancouver, Washington, was born on December 30, 1929, in Wenatchee, Washington, to parents Merle and Alice Taylor Anderson. He died on December 9, 2016, in Hermiston, Oregon, at the age of 86 years.

Dick was raised and attended schools in Ketchikan, Alaska. While in high school he played for the Ketchikan "Kayhi" Polar Bears when they won the first "All Alaska Championship" in basketball. After high school Dick went to Oregon State College where he played basketball under "Slats" Gill and joined the Air Force ROTC. During his summers he worked his way through college as one of the youngest captains of the Ketchikan commercial fishing fleet.

Dick was commissioned and attended flight school before he served his first tour in Frankfurt, Germany, where he met his beautiful wife Irene. Daughter Ginny was born while they were stationed in Germany, daughter Karen in Texas, and son Tom in France. Additional tours were served in South Carolina, England, Oregon, and Thailand during the Vietnam War and again in Germany. In 1973 he retired at the rank of lieutenant colonel to Corvallis, Oregon, where he worked in real estate for another 20 years.

Dick and Irene moved to Vancouver, Washington, in 1994 to be closer to their children and then Dick recently moved to Hermiston. Richard had many nicknames, but the one he was proudest of

was "Papa." He adored and was active in all nine of his grandchildren's lives, teaching them all to swim, checking each report card and attending as many of their athletic events as he could. Dick loved flying for the Air Force, following the OSU Beavers, the outdoors and traveling all over the world. He will be remembered most for his love of family and country.

He is survived by his daughters Ginny Holthus and her husband Jay of Hermiston and Karen Emmons and her husband Dan of Vancouver, Washington; son Tom Anderson of Hillsboro, Oregon; brother Bill Anderson and wife Darlene of Vancouver, Washington; sister Pat Revell and husband Ed of Richland, Washington; grandchildren Krystal (Emmons) Newstrom, Justin Holthus, Danielle (Emmons) Watne, John Holthus, Michael Emmons, Kyle Anderson, Lorelle Emmons, Lauren Anderson and Jake Anderson; great-grandchildren Elle, William and Daniel; nieces Carol and Susan; nephews Ed and Scott; and several cousins. Dick was preceded in death by his wife Irene, and his parents Merle and Alice.

A graveside service with military honors will be held on Friday, December 30, 2016, at 2:00 p.m. at Willamette National Cemetery, Portland, Oregon. Immediately following will be a Celebration of Life in Vancouver, Washington.
