Fifteen volunteers recently completed a 50-hour Medical Emergency Responder (EMR) course presented by Umatilla County Fire District No. 1 in conjunction with the Echo Fire Department.

participating Students were from the Echo Fire Department, UCFD 1 and the Umatilla Fire District. Participants put in training two evenings per week and several Saturdays, said J.W. Roberts, UCFD 1 EMS coordinator. The training will allow the students to

become licensed EMRs by the state of Oregon.

"Most people do not realize the time commitment and dedication that our members go through to be able to provide such vital services to the community,' said lead instructor Rob Tooley.

An EMR is one step below an EMT. They are able to provide basic treatment and care to patients at emergency scenes and provide additional manpower to help ambulance crews when they arrive on the scene.

"Placing EMTs and paramedics in all parts of our rural county is not possible," Roberts said. "The EMR course has provided critical lifesaving training to our first responders."

The EMR course was funded by the Apple a Grant Program under the Oregon Office of Rural Health. These funds covered the cost of most of the books and instructors. and the course would not have been possible without this generous gift, Roberts


