Alton 'Roy' Lindstrom

July 1, 1935-December 10, 2016

Alton "Roy" Lindstrom, age 81, passed away on December 10th, 2016, at 1:55 p.m. in Tacoma General Hospital from complications of a stroke.

Born in Lone, Ore., on July 1, 1935, to Franklin and Edris Lindstrom, also of Lone, Roy was the oldest of twin boys. Roy and Arthur attended a one-room school-house north of Lone, and graduated from Lone High School in 1954. The brothers joined the Army in 1958, and were honorably discharged in 1960.

After returning to Lone, Roy raised cattle and dryland wheat along with his father and brother as Lindstrom & Sons on 4,000 acres north of Lone. In 1962, Roy married his first wife, Janet Mason (Brink), and the couple had two children together, Paula J. Lindstrom and Troy J. Lindstrom.

In 1968, the twin brothers opened Lindstrom Brother Iron Works specializing in the fabrication of implement hitches, boom trucks, flatbed trailers and many other products still in use 50 years later. When circle irrigation was in its infancy the two brothers successfully designed and built their own hydraulic driven pivot irrigation system. Eventually, Roy and Art ventured on, each taking their skills on separate paths. Roy chose to continue with his fabrication and welding talents, opening a shop known as Royal Welding. His work ethic and friendly nature brought him much success.

In 1981, Roy married Billie Akers and they began traveling together to various states through the U.S. Eventually the couple found they preferred to stay in the northern area of Washington state. Roy was well known

for his talent and knowledge in designing, fabricating and producing many items throughout his lifetime, although his love for cooking enabled him to combine his hobby and work by building numerous smokers and barbecues for his customers. He was a hard-working man and he continued this activity until his last days.

Roy lived a lifetime full of love, never forgetting his roots, and he remained in contact with his childhood friends. He and Billie returned to

visit the town of Lone where there would be celebrations and shared memories of time gone by whenever they could.

Roy was preceded in death by his parents, his daughter Paula Lindstrom, and first wife Janet Lindstrom.

He is survived by his second wife and beloved partner of 35 years, Billie (Akers) Lindstrom, of Puyallup, Wash.; his twin brother and sister-in law, Art and June Lindstrom of Pendleton; Roy's son and daughter-in-law, Troy J. and Lori Lindstrom of Umatilla; stepson Bill J. Brink; stepchildren Mike Akers, Davina Lindstrom and Deanna Spencer; grandchildren Nikki McElligott O'Connell, Bree Renew, Alisha Akers, Stephen Spencer, Gabrielle Brock, Jennifer Stoeger, Jon Jon Boyce and Chelsie Spencer; and the light of his life, Roy's great-grandchildren Elaina Brock and Aria Stoeger. Other survivors include multiple nieces and nephews, cousins and close family friends.

Memorial services will take place at the United Church of Christ in Lone, Oregon. Interment will be in the Lindstrom family plot. Services are pending and will be announced at a future date.

Bank of Eastern Oregon reports increased earnings for 2016

BEO Bancorp and its subsidiary, Bank of Eastern Oregon, are reporting year end earnings of more than \$3.3 million for 2016, up 12.3 percent over 2015.

Total assets also increased 7 percent, from \$357.3 million to \$382.2 million. Net loans came in at \$302.3 million, up 6.6 percent from 2015, and deposits grew 7 percent from \$317.7 million to \$340.1 million.

Jeff Bailey, BEO Bancorp president and CEO, said net income is at an all-time high for the bank.

"We are very pleased with the 2016 results," Bailey said in a statement.

After years of strong commodity prices, Bailey

Search and rescue honors volunteers

PENDLETON — The Umatilla County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue Unit responded to 28 incidents in 2016, according to a written statement from the sheriff's office, and on Jan. 20 the team honored members at its annual awards banquet.

Search and rescue members logged 1,374 hours in 2016, the sheriff's office reported, including looking for evidence on three homicide investigations, an emergency evacuation at the Weigh Station Fire near Meacham, and two searches for missing children. Volunteers also had a total of 551 hours of training. The sheriff's office awarded the following at the ceremony:

- Volunteer of the Year to Travis Lundquist;
- Special Act Award to Bob English and Travis Lunquist for setting up a rope rescue system that allowed for safe rescue and custody of a naked man who was stuck in a tree above the Umatilla River, Pendleton.

- Award for Valor to Cadie the Canine for guarding her handler, Emma Hubbard, during wilderness survival overnight camp, while surrounded by howling wolves.
- And the Bloopster Award to Umatilla County emergency manager Tom Roberts for crashing a drone on his first solo flight.
