Defendant Jason Glen Drake wins fight for records in sex crimes case

PENDLETON — The attorney for sex-crimes defendant Jason Glen Drake of Rieth won a court fight to review sensitive records.

Attorney Mark C. Cogan of Portland filed a request late last year in Umatilla County Circuit Court to obtain certain records from the Oregon Department of Human Services and Department of Justice, as well as local schools and doctors. The requests include the victim’s medical records, for example, to show there was no evidence of sexual abuse.

Cogan during a phone interview Friday said he subpoenaed the records to have a judge review them and determine which he could use to defend his client. Circuit Judge Christopher Brauer granted the defense attorney’s request at hearing Jan. 26.

Drake, 41, has pleaded not guilty to six counts of first-degree sodomy and two counts of first-degree sexual abuse. The Umatilla County District Attorney’s Office has accused Drake of crimes against two children younger than 12.

Drake is free on bail, and the next hearing in the case is April 7.

Local law enforcement adds to ranks

PENDLETON — Three local law enforcement agencies have new graduates from the Oregon Public Safety Academy.

Morrow County sheriff’s deputy Aaron Haak and Stanfield police officer Cody Marcum graduated Jan. 20 from the academy’s basic police class. And Stephanie Miller graduated Feb. 10 from the basic parole and probation officer class and will work out of the Pendleton headquarters of the Umatilla County Community Justice Department.

Marcum is from Stanfield. He served as a firefighter and worked as an on-call railroad conductor before taking the police job. Bryon Zumwalt, Stanfield police chief, said he is training Marcum in the field and aims to have the rookie working solo in April.

Morrow County undersheriff John Bowels said Haak (pronounced “hawk”) is from Heppner and left a job with the Oregon Department of Transportation to work as a parole and probation officer in Morrow County, then moved into a deputy vacancy at the sheriff’s office. Haak could be working on his own in a few months, Bowels said, depending on how quickly he makes it through field training.

Miller was the coordinator of the Umatilla County Drug Court, which she also graduated from years ago, before going on to earn a master’s degree and build a family. Community Justice director Dale Primmer said Miller is a great success story. She will operate out of Pendleton. The parole and probation agency also has a field training manual that Miller will have to complete to demonstrate certain job skills.

while suspended/revoked. She also had three warrants for her arrest.

Court records show Montee has an August 2013 conviction in Umatilla County for DUII, and another DUII arrest in October 2014 led to a second conviction, which included a driver’s license suspension of three years. She also has November 2014 convictions for driving while suspended and driving uninsured, and in June 2016 the state again charged her with driving while suspended. The Umatilla County Circuit Court issued the warrants for her arrest that summer when she did not pay fines and did not appear for court hearings.
