Folklife network seeks traditional folk artists

EUGENE — To help ensure tribal, cultural, religions and occupational traditions are passed on, traditional artists are being sought to teach their art form to others.

The Oregon Folklife Network is looking for people accomplished in traditional folk arts, including American Indian basket weaving and storytelling, old-time fiddling, working cowboys, saddle makers, Norwegian cooking and baking, African-American gospel singing, southeast Asian dancing and more. The Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program offers a \$3,000 stipend to teach their art form to apprentices.

Oregonians engaged in living cultural traditions are encouraged to apply. The program does not fund historic re-enactments, do-it-yourself crafts or those who practice traditions that are not part of their own cultural heritage.

Inspired by the upcoming total solar eclipse — which will pass over Baker City and other parts of the region Aug. 21 — Crossroads Carnegie Art Center is seeking artwork for a show titled "The Path of Totality."

Amateur and professional artists 18 and older are invited to explore the theme from any angle they choose. Some may be inspired literally by celestial ideas and others may find inspi-

ration by the title and the implications of the words, or combination of words — the sky is the limit.

The gallery will accept up to three pieces of artwork

from each person, though some size restrictions may apply. In addition, entries should include a brief statement of 50 words or less regarding the artist's

interpretation of the theme. The entry fee is \$15 for members and \$20 for non-members. A people's choice award of \$100 will be selected during the opening reception. Additional awards will be announced.

Artists are encouraged to have their work for sale — there is a 30 percent commission for members and 40 percent for non-members.

Artwork for the show is accepted Monday, April 3 from 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Crossroads Carnegie Art Center, 2020 Auburn Ave., Baker City. The show opens Friday, April 7 from 5:30-8 p.m. It closes Saturday, April 29. All unsold artwork must be picked up Monday, May 1.
