An Oregon State Police trooper at 5:23 p.m. responded to a crash on the westbound side of Interstate 84 near milepost 204 where the driver of a Chevrolet HHR lost control and the vehicle rolled three times in the median.

An ambulance took the driver, Stephanie A. Stout, 23, no address provided, to St. Anthony Hospital, Pendleton. The trooper found a powdery white substance on her identification, according to state police, and it tested positive for methamphetamine.

The trooper talked to Stout at the hospital, according to state police, and she admitted to driving while high on meth. She also provided a blood sample, and the trooper cited her for DUUI and possession of meth.

•A 19-year-old Boardman man ended up in jail for drunken driving after almost striking an Oregon State Police trooper.

State police reported the trooper at 6:53 p.m. was dealing with a driver he stopped on the eastbound side of Interstate 84 near milepost 184 when a red Audi A4 sedan drove over the rumble strips on the freeway shoulder and nearly struck the police car.

After catching up to the driver and getting him stopped, according to state police, the trooper saw the driver was drunk.

Carlos Enrique Medieta Ramirez failed a sobriety test and provided a blood-alcohol level of .23 percent, just shy of three times the legal limit of .08 percent. The trooper booked Medieta Ramirez into the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton, for DUUI and reckless driving.

•State police reported another trooper made an arrest for intoxicated driving of a man who had beer and drugs.

The trooper stopped a vehicle at 11:42 p.m. for a traffic violation on Johns Lane near Snyder Road, Pendleton. The trooper booked Hall into the Umatilla County Jail for DUUI and possession of a controlled substance.

Joe Robert McDaniel was born August 3rd, 1923, in West County, Texas. He was the youngest of five children.

Joe spent the early part of his childhood growing up in Texas and went through many life-changing hardships, which included surviving the Dust Bowl and the Great Depression. He later moved to Montana where he graduated from Harrison High School. After school he proudly served his country as a U.S. Marine (Semper Fi). He served in the Pacific Theater and saw action on several beachheads, most notably Saipan.

After his honorable discharge in 1946, he returned to Montana where he worked with his dad and brother ranching for several years. Then a young lady by the name of Shirley Reel "caught his eye" and wedding bells would follow. In the fall of 1950, they were married and this union would last for more than 61 years and produce five children.

While living in Montana the first three children Donald, Maurice, and Tia were added. Then the young family found themselves moving across country to Arkansas where Glenda and Mark would round out their growing family. The pull of Montana was strong, though, and they found themselves once again returning to the Big Sky Country.

The early 1960s brought an employment opportunity for Joe and the family re-

located to Parkdale, Ore. When the winters in the shadows of Mt. Hood became too extreme they went in search of a warmer climate and found themselves relocating to Hermiston. In 1999, with all of their children grown and out of the nest, Joe and Shirley decided to downsize so they sold the farm and for the first time in their lives "became city folks" when they moved to Pasco, Washington.

This would be their home until Shirley passed away in December of 2012. In 2014 Joe would find himself on the move one last time, back to Hermiston where he would live until his peaceful passing on February 23rd, 2017.

Joe was preceded in death by his wife Shirley, and sons Donald and Maurice. Survivors include daughters Tia and Doug Paine of Hermiston, and Glenda and Keith Thomsen of Simi Valley, Calif.; son Mark and Graciela McDaniel of Hermiston, Ore.; six grandchildren: Tiffany, Tracy, Thaleia, Kurtis, Andrea and Kieran; and 10 great-grandchildren: Britt, Taylor, Jake, Megan, Kaylin, Brody, Kemper, Aviva, Pearl and Cirrus.
