## Trail Blazers stuffed by Jazz

## Portland's lead on final playoff spot shrinks to just half game

SALT LAKE CITY — Smaller, quicker guards have given the Utah Jazz fits in many instances this season. Tuesday wasn't one of them.

Gordon Hayward scored 30 points and Rudy Gobert added 20 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Jazz to a 106-87 victory over the Portland Trail Blazers.

The Jazz controlled the game most of the night with a defensive effort that bottled up everyone not named C.J. McCollum, and the Blazers never found a consistent offensive flow.

"We have so much respect for their guards and our guys know the urgency it takes to guard them," Jazz coach Quin Snyder said. "So we're working hard. At the same time, you have to be fortunate with those guys. A lot of shots they missed tonight, they're capable of making. "You kind of knock on wood a little bit."

On the other end, Hayward was an efficient 12 for 20 from the floor, including 4 for 6 from behind the arc. Gobert recorded his 57th double-double and continued to

show his offensive growth in the pick-and-roll game. He also had three blocks and constantly altered shots in the paint.

"The way they guarded me tonight, I was able to get some looks early," Hayward said, "with the big being back and so there was a lot of space to operate. That got me going early."

"Rudy did a good job screening them and freeing me, then I could attack the big downhill and kind of have whatever I wanted. Once you see a couple shots go in, too, that definitely makes you feel better."

The Jazz opened the fourth quarter with a 15-6 stretch to take a 90-70 lead that put away the game.

McCollum scored 25 for the Blazers and Damian Lillard finished with 16.

"I didn't shoot the ball well," Lillard said. "Didn't impact the game as much as I would have liked. ... They're on a string out there on the defensive end and they made it tough for us. You got to give them credit. But I also felt like I had some looks I should have made, I usually do make that I didn't."

"We're ready to go home and finish the season out strong and we know that we control what

Seattle leaves 10 runners on base in loss

HOUSTON — Brian McCann's focus this offseason was finding a way to hit more balls to the opposite field like he used to earlier in his career.

On Tuesday night against the Mariners it paid off when he got his first hit with the Astros on an opposite field home run that helped Houston to a 2-1 win.

"A lot of work went into this offseason with my swing to be able to do that," he said. "Over the last two years I'd just become a dead pull hitter and I put a lot of hours in the cage for that swing right there. I

to left-center in the sixth inning.

McCullers (1-0), slowed by injuries for chunks of last season, allowed one run and five hits while fanning seven in six innings. It was his first start since August 2 after he missed the last two months of last year with an elbow injury.

"I felt really good most of the start. I felt pretty locked in," he said. "I thought I was working the fastball pretty good. The curveball mix was pretty good. I mixed in a couple changeups along the way, so it was good."

#### Tony Romo retires, joins CBS Sports

DALLAS (AP) — Tony Romo is retiring from the Dallas Cowboys to replace another former quarterback in Phil Simms as lead analyst for CBS.

The network announced Tuesday that Romo will be paired with Jim Nantz on Thursday night and Sunday games next season. The former 10-year starter considered multiple network offers while also deciding whether to keep playing after losing the Dallas job after Dak Prescott last season.

The departure of the all-time passing leader has been expected since November, when Romo conceded the job after missing 10 weeks with a back injury.

CBS Sports Chairman Sean McManus said the network planned to keep Simms and was working on finding another role for their lead analyst the past 19 seasons.

Oklahoma City Thunder guard after tying Oscar Robertson's single-season record with his 41st triple-double in a 110-79 win over Milwaukee on Tuesday. Westbrook had 12 points, 13 rebounds and 13 assists. It was his 78th career triple-double, matching Wilt Chamberlain for fourth all-time.

#### Oregon State baseball wins 20th consecutive game

PORTLAND — The Oregon State baseball team just keeps on winning.

Coming off of a sweep of the Stanford Cardinal over the weekend, the top-ranked Beavers beat Portland 4-3 on Tuesday evening in a non-conference game. It marks the 20th consecutive victory for the Beavers (25-1), extending their school record.

The Pilots did make the Beavers nervous for a bit on Tuesday, holding a 3-2 lead over the Beavers after five innings. However in the sixth, Oregon State's Adley Rutschman ripped a pinch-hit single to bring in a pair of runs which put the Beavers on top for good at 4-3.

Oregon State's pitching staff tied a school record with 18 strikeouts, led by Brandon Eisert who struck out nine in 3 1/3 innings of relief.

Oregon State next opens a three-game series against Utah on Friday.
