Wilson overtime goal lifts Capitals

WASHINGTON — Toronto native Tom Wilson scored his first NHL playoff goal 5:15 into overtime and the Washington Capitals survived a scare to beat the Maple Leafs 3-2 on Thursday night in Game 1 of their first-round series.

The top-seeded Capitals came back from a two-goal deficit to take the early lead in the series and at least momentarily stop the panic about a slip-up. Justin Williams scored twice in regulation, and Washington showed it could handle the adversity of falling behind.

Braden Holtby was up to the task in goal, stopping 35 of the 37 shots he faced. Toronto counterpart Frederik Andersen was arguably the best player on the ice with 41 saves before being beaten by Wilson with an absurd shot on the winner.

Mitch Mamer and Jake Gardiner scored in the first period for Toronto, back in the playoffs for the first time since 2013.

Game 2 is Saturday night in Washington.

PREDATORS 1, BLACKHAWKS 0 — At Chicago, Pekka Rinne made 29 saves, Viktor Arvidsson scored in the first period and Nashville beat Chicago in Game 1.

Rinne's second career postseason shutout sent Nashville to just its second playoff win in Chicago in seven tries. The Predators did not have a 1-0 victory during the regular season.

Corey Crawford had 19 saves for Chicago.

Game 2 is Saturday night at the United Center.

DUCKS 3, FLAMES 2 — At Anaheim, Calif., Jakob Silfverberg scored the tiebreaking power-play goal late in the second period, and captain Ryan Getzlaf had a goal and an assist to lead Anaheim in the series opener.

Rickard Rakell scored the tying goal after Calgary made a horrendous line change in the second period, and John Gibson made 30 saves for the Ducks.

Brian Elliott stopped 38 shots for the wild-card Flames. Game 2 is Saturday night at Honda Center.

That's why Stewart says she's comfortable returning to 1A Nixyaawii for her senior season when a player of her talent could become a major recruit playing on the larger stage that would be offered at 5A Pendleton. She said it's a choice she gets asked about a lot, and she hasn't made a final decision yet, but if she does leave Nixyaawii it's not because she's looking for more exposure.

Madden said he's still trying to sell her on the idea of playing basketball in college. It's a harder sell than one would imagine.

"We've had some conversations about playing in college," he said. "For me as a coach you can see that would be an avenue for her to get her school paid for. I think deep down she doesn't want basketball to define who she is and I'm just trying to tell her it's just a means to an end."

"I'm trying to just make sure she keeps all her options open. It's gotta be her choice so I'm trying to not put too much pressure on her. Whatever she decides I will support her because that's her future and she's got to make those decisions, and I try not to influence that one way or another."

"I haven't really focused on that because I still have next year and I'm still thinking about it," she said.

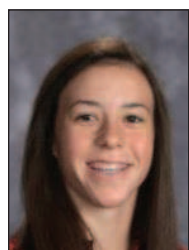
As for more immediate plans, Stewart said she hopes to have a new tattoo to display by the next time she takes the court. She

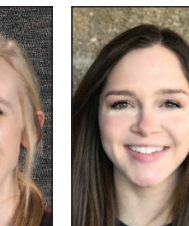

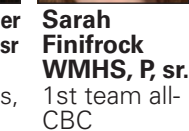

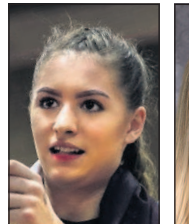

Saints.

The 6-foot-7 forward was a NWAC All-East Region second team selection in 2016-17, after he averaged team-high 15.8 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. Over his 46 game career for the Timberwolves, Mathews averaged 15 points and 9.6 rebounds per game and shot 57 percent from the floor.

"Jared came to BMCC as a very skilled low post player," BMCC head coach Gavin Burt said in a press release. "His ability to finish with his left and right hand on multiple fundamental moves makes him a great 4-year prospect. He continues to work on new angles of his game while adding strength and size to his frame."

The Saint Martin's Saints compiled a 17-13 overall

record and a 10-10 mark inside Greater Northwest Athletic Conference play. The team is coached by Alex Pribble, who is in his third year with the school. Pribble said in a statement on SMUSaints.com that Mathews is a perfect fit for his team.

"Jared is a fantastic addition to the program. He is an athletic and skilled player, who rebounds the ball at a high level," Pribble said. "He is also an extremely high-character young man, and will be a great representative of Saint Martin's."

Mathews is one of four signees for the Saints next season, but he will not be the only player with ties to Pendleton on the Saints next season. Pendleton High senior Caden Smith is also signed with Saint Martin's and will join the team this fall as well.
