The current growth trend predicts the district's population will increase 24% which equates to 1,100 additional students in seven years. Without new construction and renovation, the district could need 56 more modular classrooms. 1/5 of the student population will be served in temporary classrooms by 2023.

Earth Day includes science fair, tree giveaway

In recognition of Earth Day, several activities are planned in Pendleton.

A March for Science kicks off the event Saturday at 11 a.m. at Roy Raley Park, 1205 S.W. Court Ave. Organized by a grassroots group of local people, the event highlights the importance of partnerships formed between scientists and the broader community.

Event organizers indicate it's important for scientists to share their findings and engage the communities they serve.

From noon to 4 p.m., there's a Community Science Fair at the park. It will include family-friendly activities, information booths, live music, food vendors and a brew garden. Demonstrations and displays will include drone technology, FFA student projects, Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, KBLU radio, Interpath Laboratory, the Umatilla County weed department's invasive weed information trailer and more.

An Earth Day Community Science Fair and other activities are planned Saturday from noon to 4 p.m. at Roy Raley Park in Pendleton.

Entertainment will feature the GP Jammers, who will provide old-time music from 2-3 p.m. Also, local musicians will present open mic sets throughout the afternoon.

Also, held in conjunction with the event, people can get a free tree as part of the annual Arbor Day free tree giveaway. Sugar pine, ponderosa pine, water birch and ninebark will be available from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Representatives from Pendleton

Parks & Recreation, the Pendleton Tree Commission and the Umatilla National Forest Service will distribute 500 seedling trees.

The event will assist the parks department in reaching the "Pendleton Plant 1,000 Trees Initiative." For more about the initiative, visit www.pendletonparksandrec.com/pendleton-trees.
