At the jail, Droody took a breath test that revealed his blood-alcohol level was .28 percent, more than three times the legal limit of .08 percent.

According to medical information, blackouts from alcohol can occur around .2 percent, and someone with a blood-alcohol level of .25 percent is on the verge of alcohol poisoning. People with that much alcohol in their system suffer severe loss of mental and physical functions and face an increased risk of choking to death on their vomit.
