Outside of managing her business seven days a week, Phyllis enjoyed

gardening. Her green thumb was evident in her beautiful African violets and backyard blooms. She was also a skilled seamstress, sewing matching outfits for her young daughters and sewing the quintessential '80s prom dress for one daughter then turning it into a bridesmaid's dress for the other daughter's wedding.

The real love of Phyllis' life was her grandchildren. She doted on her two grandsons in

Pendleton and traveled to Austin, Texas, to visit two more grandsons and her granddaughter as often as possible. There were many school events, band concerts, sleepovers and games in grandma's large backyard.
