He and his wife set up the first exhibit of the Hall of Fame, where he hobnobbed with the likes of

Judge Jim Sturgess, "Pink" Boylen, and George Fletcher. He designed and executed with volunteers stage settings for the Kiwanis Kapers for several years.

For 30 years Lee worked at U.S. Gypsum, reconstituted as Masonite and finally Wood Fiber. He started as a lab technician in R and D, then served as general foreman in the boardmill. Later he was superintendent of quality, and finally superintendent of the boardmill. He took great pride in the accomplishments of the people in his departments.

Lee is survived by Roberta, his wife of nearly 50 years, and his children Anthony (DeeDee) and Jennifer I. Foss. His grandsons Jason (Megan) and Nicholas, and Jennifer's son Carlo D'Amato brought him great joy, as did his great-grandchildren Kylie, Kaitand Noah.
