during one of these visits Bill met the love of his life, Jean. Shortly after meeting her he proclaimed to his sister that he was "going to marry that girl one day." On March 10, 1998, in Reno, Nevada, the two were wed.

Their living arrangements on a golf course year-round in Woodburn, Oregon, and Surprise, Arizona, allowed for the two to indulge in all the golf they wanted. Bill also found a lot of joy as Jean played the piano and sang songs. They enjoyed all of the time they were able to spend together and among their family and in their travels together.
