In honor of Eric, contributions may be made to the Cove Scholarship Fund at The Episcopal Church of the Redeemer.

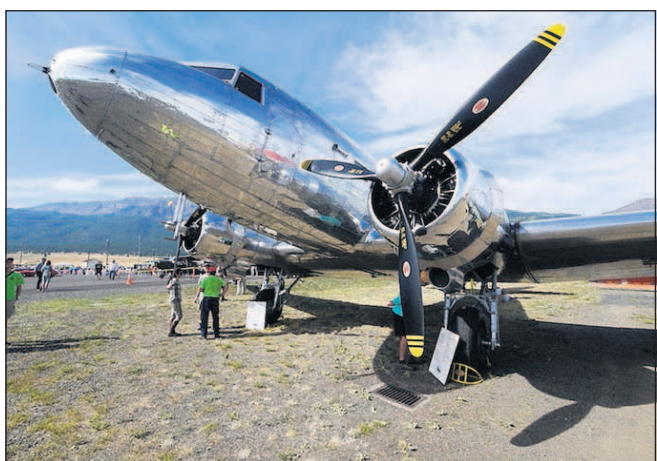
