 July 21, 1929 - September 1, 2017

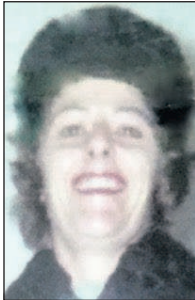
Lola Elizabeth "Lib" Barrett, 88, of Arlington, Oregon, passed gently into her eternal life on September 1, 2017.
