Tamástslíkt exhibit examines WWII Japanese-American confinement site

A new exhibit at Tamástslíkt Cultural Institute highlights the complexities of the largest Japanese-American confinement sites during World War II.

"Art of Survival — Enduring the Turmoil of Tule Lake" opens Friday in the museum, located near Wildhorse Resort & Casino in Mission.

The Tule Lake location was the largest of the 10 confinement sites. In addition, anyone deemed a troublemaker by the federal government was relocated there.

It became the only officially designated segregation center. Ruled under martial law, it was the most controversial of all the camps.

Many of the people who were brought in under segregation were people who knew their rights and were willing to stand up to the injustice.

Through haunting images of artifacts by photographer

Hiroshi Watanabe, people are given a glimpse into the lives of those who were held at Tule

Lake. Also, oral histories provide varying views on some of the complex issues of Tule Lake in the voices of those held captive.

The exhibition also explores the power of propaganda, up-to-date terminology relating to the confinement experience, the history behind the incarceration and what happened when the camp closed.

The exhibit is the result of a cooperative effort with the Tule Lake Unit of WWII Valor in the Pacific National Monument and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Tamástslíkt Cultural Institute is open Monday through Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Regular museum admission is \$10 for adults, \$9 for seniors, \$6 for youths 6-17 and free for ages 5 and under.

Health care open enrollment starts Wednesday

SALEM — Health insurance open enrollment — for those who buy plans on their own because they do not have coverage through their employer — launches Wednesday.

The open enrollment period runs through Dec. 15 at HealthCare.gov. People can change plans or buy a plan for coverage and avoid a potential penalty on their 2018 taxes.

"In Oregon, we want people to get health insurance," said Gov. Kate Brown. "Already, 95 percent of Oregonians are covered and 100 percent of children have access."

The Oregon Health Insurance Marketplace, a division of the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services, provides local assistance over the phone and through a statewide network of health insurance agents and community partners.
