Tree fall victim near Heppner was Hillsboro firefighter

HEPPNER — A Hillsboro firefighter and paramedic died Friday on a hunting trip with a friend near Heppner when a tree fell on him.

Ryan Grimaldi, 31, was identified as the victim Saturday. He had been with the Hillsboro Fire Department for six years, according to a press release from the agency.

On Sunday, Grimaldi was escorted home by a procession of fire and police vehicles from the Morrow County Sheriff's Office, Hillsboro, and several agencies from the Willamette Valley. As they reached the Portland area, several firefighters stood on overpasses in uniform, either on or in front of their engines, and saluted him.

His fellow firefighters will wear mourning bands on their badges until his memorial service on Saturday, Nov. 11. No venue has been selected.

"Ryan was an outstanding firefighter and member of the Hillsboro Fire Department family," operation chief Scott Magers stated. "Ryan served the department and the community well. He will be greatly missed."

According to *The*

Oregonian/OregonLive, Grimaldi volunteered for the Hillsboro Firefighters Random Acts charity organization and was voted Hillsboro Firefighter of the Year in 2015 by his fellow firefighters.

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call Friday around 11 a.m. reporting a tree fell on the man, and he was unresponsive and not breathing.

Morrow County Under-sheriff John Bowles said Grimaldi and one friend were in the Heppner area for second-season elk hunting. He said the two were cutting firewood when the accident happened.

"He liked to come up here and hunt, it wasn't his first time," Bowles said.

Bowles said Grimaldi had a fiancée.

The sheriff's office reported on Friday that Grimaldi's hunting partner hiked up a ridge to get cellphone service and reach 911.

Before responders arrived, the caller reported that Grimaldi had died. The Heppner Ambulance, Heppner Rural Fire Department and U.S. Forest Service law enforcement assisted the sheriff's office.
