

PIRATES: Riverside to face defending state champions Catlin Gabel in title match

going to go undefeated and that we can't let anybody come in and show us how they are going to play. We had to let them know how we play."

The Pirates did just that. After taking control of the pace early, Riverside had plenty of looks at the goal and out-shot De La Salle four to one in the first 10 minutes of play.

The ball spent most of the time on the Knights' half, forcing De La Salle to play physical defense in order to keep Riverside at bay.

The Knights (11-4-2 overall) couldn't maintain that pressure for long and gave up their first goal 24 minutes into the game.

Riverside set up for a corner kick from the right side of the field where senior Quincy Castillo sent the ball flying across the goal. Fellow senior Misael Madrigal was there to punch it in for Riverside's first point of the game.

The Pirates would tack on one more before half-time after seniors Kevin Madrigal and Jose Peralta paired up for a goal. It would be Peralta's first of two on the night.

Once both teams returned from intermission, De La Salle came out with a newfound energy and began playing much more aggressively. That was no surprise to the Pirates, who were expecting a tough opponent.

"I was expecting them to be physically tough," Peralta said. "They are big guys, but we were the better team today."

Riverside went on to prove that throughout the second half. The Pirates took away the few chances the Knights had by beating them to fifty-fifty balls and taking away passing lanes. Allthwhile, the Pirates' offense continued to attack.

Riverside went on to score two more goals in the second half. Peralta claimed the first after an assist from senior Alexis Mendoza and sophomore Ulyces Lopez scored the final goal on a break away.

Now as Riverside has three days to prepare for its third trip to the state championship game in school history. And standing in the way of a possible state title is the defending champion No. 3 Catlin Gabel Eagles, a team that the Pirates are very familiar with. The two teams met this year on the last day of the regular season and played to a 2-2 draw, and last year the Eagles

ousted the Pirates from the playoffs with a 4-1 victory in the state semifinals.

"As of right now, the only team that really challenged us was Catlin-Gabel," Duenas said. "That (game) showed us what we really need to focus on and we're going to make sure we do that."

The Pirates and Eagles will play for the 3A/2A/1A state title on Saturday at Liberty High School in Hillsboro. The kickoff time

has yet to be determined.

first Final Four appearance since 1939. He averaged 16.1 points, 3.2 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game during his final season.

With Ben McLemore (foot) and Wayne Seldon (quadriceps) out injured, Brooks made his third start of the season.

The Grizzlies jumped out to a 21-14 lead, but Portland closed the gap early in the second quarter and Evan Turner's pull-up jumper tied it at 29. Damian Lillard missed his first seven shots from the field, finally ending the drought on a layup with 3:12 left in

the first half.

Injuries have defined most of Richardson's career to this point. It started at the end of his rookie season when Richardson suffered a torn ACL in a playoff game against Carolina. He missed the first half of the 2015 season still recovering and when he did return, he suffered a season-ending hamstring injury on his only catch of the year, a 40-yard reception down the sideline.

He returned healthy in 2016 but struggled to find a role in the offense until late in the season. He finished the regular season with 21 catches, but had seven receptions and a touchdown in Seattle's two playoff games. The Seahawks had seen enough from Richardson to feel confident going into this season that his role could increase and he could essentially take the place of Kearse.

That's largely what has happened. Richardson has at least two catches in every game. He leads the team in touchdowns. Richardson's offseason work catching passes from Wilson in Los Angeles is paying off.

"What Paul Richardson has been able to do this year is a testament to his hard

work, and is a testament to everything he's been doing all offseason, honestly," Wilson said. "He had an unbelievable offseason; he was getting tons of work down in L.A., we were getting together throwing a bunch and it's really proving that he's really back at a high level."

Of course, the timing couldn't be better for Richardson. His rookie contract is up after the season, and while Richardson understands that's his reality, he's doing his best not to let it be a distraction.

"My agent wants me to stay focused, just like my family wants me to stay focused. Don't play with hypothetical because it can have an effect on my play and that's the last thing I want affected," Richardson said. "I know the more I do on the field the more it speaks for itself."
