

Lawsuit proceeds against planned pot operation

MCMINNVILLE (AP) — A Yamhill County judge has denied a motion to dismiss a complaint filed by a vineyard juana growers.

owner against aspiring marivineyard The Momtazi Family LLC, claims marijuana odors would damage wine grapes with

"foul-smelling particles."

The Capital Press newspaper reports Steven, Mary and Richard Wagner asked the judge to throw out the lawsuit because there was no evidence that odors would cross property lines and because the planned marijuana operation wasn't yet definite. They also

cited the state's right-to-farm law, which prohibits nuisance and trespass lawsuits against common farming practices.

Judge John Collins said the right-to-farm law doesn't provide the growers with blanket immunity, but can be used as a defense later in the case.
