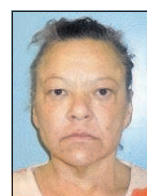

SENTENCES

PENDLETON — The following felony sentences have been imposed in Umatilla County courts:

•Kristen Renee Fristoe, 26, Pendleton, pleaded guilty to Assaulting Public Safety Officer: sentenced to 14 days jail, 3 years probation, 180 sanction units, 90 maximum jail units, 120 hours community service, \$200 fine and \$1,300 fine-suspended.

•Thomas Benard Patt, 56, Pendleton, pleaded guilty to Possession of Methamphetamine: sentence to discharge.

•Miguel Angel Chavez, 31, Salem (OSP), pleaded guilty to Assault of Public Safety Officer: sentenced to 13 months Oregon Dept. of Corrections (DOC), and 2 years post-prison supervision.

Lawsuit proceeds against planned pot operation

MCMINNVILLE (AP) — A Yamhill County judge has denied a motion to dismiss a complaint filed by a vineyard owner against aspiring marijuana growers.

The vineyard owner, Momtazi Family LLC, claims marijuana odors would damage wine grapes with

“foul-smelling particles.” The *Capital Press* newspaper reports Steven, Mary and Richard Wagner asked the judge to throw out the lawsuit because there was no evidence that odors would cross property lines and because the planned marijuana operation wasn't yet definite. They also

cited the state's right-to-farm law, which prohibits nuisance and trespass lawsuits against common farming practices.

Judge John Collins said the right-to-farm law doesn't provide the growers with blanket immunity, but can be used as a defense later in the case.
