1-11-1 overall and 0-5-1 in league play. Their lone win was 4-1 over Redmond on Sept. 21, though the biggest highlight of the season came at home on Oct. 10 when the Buckaroos played a tough game and earned a 1-1 draw with rival Hermiston. The draw snapped a 15-game losing streak to the Bulldogs.

Pendleton moves into a new league, the InterMountain Conference, next season where it will battle CRC holdovers Hood River Valley and The Dalles along with Ridgeview, Redmond, and Crook County.

"Also I am aware that we have an extremely young core of varsity players returning next year ... so I felt a change needed to be made," Talbot said. "This was as good of a time as any to do so because a new coach will have a couple of years with the majority of the players to help the program take the next step forward. I fully expect the PHS boys program to compete at a high level next season, and have a terrific shot in earning a playoff berth in the new league.'
