Keith married Gerry Migles and from the marriage a beautiful daughter, Toni, was born.


Keith was a handyman who had a variety of jobs including construction,

Charles G. "Chuck" Christiansen of John Day, former longtime Hermiston, Oregon, resident, was born on March 13, 1932, in Alta, Iowa, to parents Carl William and Johana (Joan) Alberta Hobbs Christiansen. He died on November 14, 2017, in Prairie City, Oregon, at the age of 85 years.

Chuck was raised and attended school in Alta, Iowa, where he participated in football and basketball. He moved to Reno, Nevada, in 1950 and later enlisted in the United States Navy. Chuck was stationed in Kingsville, Texas, and trained to be a fireman.

While stationed in Texas he met Betty L. Smith and they were united in marriage on October 17, 1953, in Kingsville, Texas. Chuck was honorably discharged and returned to Reno, Nevada, where they lived until 1970, moving to Irrigon, Oregon, and working as a fireman at the Umatilla Army Depot until 1979. He worked at Sherrell Chevrolet in Hermiston on his days off for several years before moving to Hermiston in 1975 and making a full-time change to work at Sherrell's in 1979. He worked at Sherrell's for 20 years and then for Myrick Chrysler/Dodge until he retired in 1994. Chuck and Betty moved to John Day, Oregon, in 1997 where they have lived since.

He was a former member of the Lions Club and a member of the Elks Lodge, and for many years he was part of the early morning coffee crew in John Day.

Chuck's greatest joy was his family. His family came first and he was always there with guidance, advice, wisdom, support and love. Chuck enjoyed attending all of the sporting events and activities that his children and grandchildren participated in over the years, and playing pinochle. He was deeply loved and will be greatly missed.



John R. Biamont

Pendleton

October 3, 1943 - November 24, 2017

John Biamont, who managed state agency offices in several towns over 37 years, died recently at age 74 in Pendleton, his hometown.

With steadfast support from his wife Sharon, Biamont managed offices from Astoria to Ontario for such agencies as Adult and Family Services, child welfare, Vocational Rehabilitation, and seniors with disabilities. He was educated at the University of Oregon in the 1960s and earned a master's degree while doing social work in Texas. He retired from the field in 2002.

A significant part of John Biamont's young life was treatment at the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children in Portland. He said years later that advice from his mother was key in helping him cope with the challenges of growing into manhood. When some of his classmates bullied the kid with short arms, John's mother reportedly said, "No one cares, John, and

if you can't deal with this, you are going to feel sorry for yourself for the rest of your life." John said he learned to use his legs and feet to defend himself.

But despite that, Biamont remembers his Pendleton boyhood affectionately — riding in the back of a wheat truck, eating fresh peach pancakes, deer hunting, learning to drink coffee black. He and his male relatives loved cars. John said his favorite was a '51 Mercury coupe, which his dad souped up.

Sharon Biamont said she felt her husband's finest qualities were his honesty and his humor. The humor helped him through years of dealing with heart problems and cancer.

John Biamont is survived by his wife of 62 years, Sharon, whom he met in junior high school in Lake Oswego. John's mother was Anna Mae Schluter, his father was Joseph Biamont.
