Hermiston man warns against contracting scams

A local man is warning others about falling victim to contracting scams, claiming an unlicensed contractor has taken him for thousands of dollars by starting a concrete pouring job, then asking for more money and repeatedly delaying completion.

Chris Waine, who lives outside Hermiston, said he has been having trouble since September with a man who claimed to be a contractor and whom Waine and his wife hired to pour a concrete slab in their yard.

Since their initial interactions, Waine has filed a small claims case against the contractor, Ben Wood, and Wood has responded by requesting a hearing. Waine said they are now waiting for a specific date.

Waine said his wife posted on Facebook that they were looking to have some concrete work done, and the two got in touch over Facebook.

Waine said he asked Wood if he was licensed and certified, and that the man said no. Waine said he told Wood he wanted him to get certified before he started the job, and Wood agreed. Waine said he also asked for a written contract. Waine paid Wood \$5,040, a portion of the money Wood said he needed up front to complete the project. Waine said Wood then claimed he needed more funds to complete the job. Although he poured concrete,

Waine said Wood did a poor job and it had to be removed with a jack hammer.

Waine said he reported Wood to the Umatilla County Sheriff's Office, but the sheriff's office said because it was not a criminal matter it was out of their purview.

Wood said he did not want to comment on the situation, as it was a civil matter.

According to Stan Jessup of the Oregon Construction Contracting Board, Wood is not licensed and there is no record of him having applied for a license. He said Wood has been listed under several different business names, such as Wood Interior/ Exterior Designs, Wood Designs and BC Constructions. Jessup said Wood has been fined about \$5,000 for his activities.

Jessup said in a situation like this one, a claimant can try to file a complaint. But if the contractor is not licensed, the complaint is referred to the compliance section of the CCB. They can try to contact the person, and issue the notice of intent. The person can admit wrongdoing and pay the fine, or ask for a hearing.

If the person doesn't respond to any efforts by the CCB to get hold of them, the debt gets referred to the Department of Revenue, and can affect their standing in other accounts, such as if that person gets a tax refund.

There are several tips the Oregon Construction Contracting Board suggests to avoid getting scammed by a contractor. The board's website has a database where people can search a contractor's name to see if they are licensed. There is a "buyer beware" list, comprised of people who don't have a valid contracting license, but have taken money from homeowners or failed to pay CCB fines for violating regulations.

The website also has tips for how to avoid common scams, red flags, and ways consumers can protect themselves.

Working as an unlicensed contractor can result in thousands of dollars in fines from the state. A man was fined in April for doing unlicensed contracting work in several counties around central and Eastern Oregon. Gregory Mason Miller of Bend spent several months working as a home inspector, but had no license or certification. According to the CCB "Buyer Beware" list, Miller was using another contractor's license number.

Earlier this month, the CCB reported that Miller had pleaded guilty in nearly all of the 58 cases for which he had been charged. Felony charges included identity theft, and misdemeanor charges included unlicensed contracting. Currently, Miller is being fined \$298,000 by the state of Oregon.
