While Brady will start his 37th playoff game and extend his own record with his eighth Super Bowl appearance, Foles will start only his fourth playoff game. He started two dozen games for the Eagles over his first three NFL seasons before spending a year in St. Louis and another in Kansas City.

Here's some others that fans should keep an eye on:

**DIFFERENT STROKES:** The Patriots have three players in Gronkowski, receiver Brandin Cooks and running back Dion Lewis who had more than 1,000 scrimmage yards. The Eagles are the first team since the 1990 Giants to reach the Super Bowl with none. But the Eagles do have the league's third-ranked rushing offense with three productive backs in Jay Ajayi, LeGarrette Blount (who has 10 TDs in 10 career playoff games) and Corey Clement, whom they've relied on to take the pressure off Foles after losing Carson Wentz.

**VENUE** – U.S. Bank Stadium, downtown Minneapolis.

**TV COVERAGE** — By NBC to 222 stations throughout the United States. The game also will be streamed on NBC Sports Live and fuboTV.

**ATTENDANCE** — To date, 3,947,121 have attended Super Bowl games. The largest crowd was 103,985 at the 14th Super Bowl between Pittsburgh and the L.A. Rams at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California.
