Severed foot found on beach belonged to Washington man

SEATTLE (AP) — Authorities say a severed foot in a running shoe found on a Vancouver Island beach belonged to a Washington man.

The *Seattle Times* reports Kitsap County authorities reported 79-year-old Stanley Okumoto missing Sept. 19. His partial remains were found in November along a beach near Neah Bay, about a mile from where his car was found by authorities.

A tibia and fibula attached to a left human foot with a white ankle sock in a black running shoe was found in December on a Vancouver Island beach in the hamlet of Jordan River.

The Sooke Royal Canadian Mounted Police sent the leg to the coroners' service. *The News Mirror* of Sooke, British Columbia, reports it was confirmed, after DNA testing, that the foot and leg belonged to Okumoto.

Richard Junior Courson

Pendleton
June 26, 1923 - February 20, 2018

Richard Junior Courson was born June 26, 1923, to Richard F. and Mary L. Courson. Mr. Courson was raised and attended school in Portland, Oregon.

In May of 1942 he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps where he was trained as a paratrooper and a rifleman. Mr. Courson was engaged in several combat missions in the central and South Pacific including the assault on Iwo Jima and the occupation of Japan. He was honorably discharged from the United States Marine Corps December 31, 1945. Mr. Courson returned to Oregon where he became a smoke jumper for the U.S Forest Service for a short period of time.

Mr. Courson attended and graduated from Northwestern School of Law and was admitted to the Oregon State Bar in 1954. Mr. Courson married Coralee Jane Waters in Portland, Oregon, in 1955.

In 1956, after two years of general practice in Portland, Oregon, Mr. Courson and his wife moved to Pendleton, Oregon, where he practiced law with Mr. Ray Danner. Mr. Courson was elected to the office of district attorney in 1958 and appointed to district court judge for the

state of Oregon in 1967 by Governor McCall. He served as district court judge for the next 24 years until his retirement in 1992.

Mr. Courson was an avid outdoorsman who enjoyed hunting and fishing. He especially liked packing into the high lakes of the Wallowa Mountains and the Seven Devils area in Idaho on horseback with friends.

Mr. Courson and Bob Herbig were instrumental in reviving the Round-Up Cowboy Mounted Band

in 1985 where, under the leadership of Mr. Courson, they performed throughout the Northwest. As a newly elected Round-Up director, he saw the need for souvenirs and was instrumental in starting the souvenir program for the Pendleton Round-Up.

Mr. Courson was preceded in death by his wife, and is survived by his children Julie, Richard T. and Jeffrey K., and by several grandchildren and great-grandchildren

Visitation will be from 3 until 7 p.m. on Friday, March 2, 2018, at Pendleton Pioneer Chapel, Folsom-Bishop. A graveside service will be at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 3 at Olney Cemetery.

Doris Marie Hadden, 90, passed away Wednesday, February 21, 2018, at her son's home in Walla Walla, Washington.

Doris was born July 15, 1927, in Albion, Idaho, to the late Don Carlos and Lois Laura Anderson Asher. Carrying all their belongings in wagons, the family moved from Albion to the View Community in 1934 where she attended school until the eighth grade.

After graduating from seminary in 1944 and Burley Senior High School in 1945, Doris went to work for the first time at the locally owned Woolsworth Store and then later Kings Store in Burley.

Doris met William "Bill" Dale Hadden in April of 1946 at a dance at the Ydell Ball Room, where the next day he asked her for a date. The two were married on September 7, 1946, at her parents' home and were married for 66 years until his death in 2013.

They packed up all their wedding gifts and belongings into their little black car and moved to Pilot Rock, Oregon, in January of 1947. Doris would accompany Bill as he drove the log truck. She loved riding in the truck, being so high up you could

see everything, and the mountains were pretty. The two lived most of their lives in Pilot Rock and it is where they raised their family.

Doris and Bill were members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

She is survived by her brother Grant (Sherry) Asher of Meacham, Oregon; her children Randie (Martin) Goold of Puyallup, Washington, Craig Hadden of Shoshone, Idaho, Guy (Debbie) Hadden of Enterprise, Oregon, Aaron (Charlene) Hadden of Pilot Rock, Oregon, and Nels (Betsy) Hadden of Walla Walla, Washington; 16 grandchildren; 26 great-grandchildren; two great-great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews.
