
Mustangs ousted by Prospectors

PENDLETON — Heppner seniors Kacie Gray, Morgan Correa and Sophie Grant sat side-by-side at the end of the Mustangs bench as the final seconds of their prep basketball careers ticked away on Friday morning.

The Mustangs had just lost to Grant Union 62-46 in the

consolation round of the Class 2A state tournament at the Pendleton Convention Center, ending their season. However, the seniors' faces didn't show signs of sadness or disappointment. Instead, they were rather upbeat, soaking in the last moments of the kind of season they

could have only dreamed about for the first three years wearing the blue and gold.

'This season was crazy and we loved every minute of it," Grant said afterward. "We were really a family and each and every one of us love each other and it was a great experience to have.

"We came here as the underdog and we really surprised people, so it was an awesome experience.'

Even with the loss, the three seniors went out on a high note. They combined for 16 points, nine rebounds and three assists and all

Jaiden Lemberger, Pendleton's best outside shooting threat, dribbled the ball up the court but passed it to her left to Hallie Porter, but Porter, too, passed on a shot and instead tossed it inside to Kalan McGlothan for an easy layup to make it 54-53. However, as Crescent Valley inbounded the ball, the buzzer sounded before Pendleton could foul or try for a steal to

seal the win for the Raiders (22-4). The loss also brought about the end to the prep basketball careers of Pendleton's five-girl senior class of Maureen Davies, Rylee Gentner, Jaiden Lemberger, Kalan McGlothan and Hallie Porter. The group has certainly left its mark on the Pendleton basketball program - with a combined 55 wins, two league championships and three playoff appearances — and it left an emphatic mark as well on Friday's

McGlothan, Pendleton's workhorse in the post all season long, put together yet another doubledouble with 24 points and 17 rebounds to lead the team in both categories. Lemberger nailed a pair of 3-pointers and finished with 13 points, while Davies put up seven points and eight rebounds, Porter had three and Gentner had three.

backbone of this team," an visibly emotional Porter said afterward.

However, amidst the big offensive numbers part of what ultimately did Pendleton in was its carelessness with the basketball. The Buckaroos turned the ball over 30 times — 15

times in each half — including five in the last three minutes of the game. Too many times the Buckaroos tried to break Crescent Valley's press with long, down-court passes that a Raider defender stepped in front of, or looked for a cross-court pass that

was tipped or picked off, too.

"The game is predicated on possessions and quality possessions and we had a lot of quality possessions," Porter said, "but we gave them (Crescent Valley) a lot more

Blaney wins pole for Vegas race

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Ryan Blaney has won the pole for the NASCAR Monster Energy Cup race at Las Vegas Motor Speedway.

Blaney earned his third career pole with a lap at 191.489 mph in his Team Penske Ford on a

windy Friday night. Kevin Harvick kept up his outstanding start to the season and secured a front-row Ford lockout with a second-place finish in qualifying. The Stewart-Haas Racing stalwart earned his best

Starting position in 18 career races in Vegas by turning a lap at 190.248 mph. Fords claimed the top three spots and five of the first eight. Las Vegas native Kurt Busch qualified right behind Harvick, while Martin Truex Jr. drove his Toyota into fourth.

The 24-year-old Blaney is off to a solid start to the season with a seventh-place finish at Daytona, and he'll be in prime position in Vegas.
