# Net neutrality contracting moves closer to passage

seniors who are counting on critical services would be a huge mistake.” Oregon’s chapter of the National Federation of Independent Business called on Gov. Kate Brown to veto the bill.

“...These sole proprietorships, partnerships, LLCs and S-corps are losing out on tax savings that they would otherwise have to invest in their businesses and their employees,” the group said in a statement after the vote.

A spokesman for Brown said in a text message Friday that “as with any other bill, the Governor’s Office will review the legislation for legal sufficiency before the Governor considers signing.”

And on Thursday, in what it said was a direct response to the legislation, the state’s Small Business Association filed an initiative petition called the “Tax Parity Initiative.”

SALEM — A bill to require governmental agencies to contract only with internet providers who practice “net neutrality” is on its way to Gov. Kate Brown’s desk for a signature.

The state Senate voted 21-to-7 to pass House Bill 4155 Thursday, March 2, with bipartisan support. The House approved the bill Feb. 26.

House Majority Leader Rep. Jennifer Williamson, D-Portland, proposed the state regulations to discourage internet companies from blocking, slowing down or charging more for certain content. The Federal

Communications Commission repealed federal rules on net neutrality Dec. 14. The move prompted about 20 states, including Oregon, to sue the federal government to restore the protections.

Williamson's bill is meant to serve as an incentive to providers to keep the internet open to all Oregonians.

"It's particularly important to small businesses who are trying to create e-commerce," said Sen. Lee Beyer, D-Eugene, who urged passage of the bill on the Senate floor Thursday.
