A baptism, a funeral and a long weekend

astor Chuck Sabin at Zion Church in Newberg asked me to stand in for him last weekend while he was down in Southern California attending a family wedding. Palm Springs, not a bad place to be married in. I said yes, because most of the time it is always better to say yes, unless the Holy Spirit shakes your

head to make you say no. This weekend would need me for two funeral services both of these on Saturday, one in the church in Newberg and another at the graveside in the cemetery in McMinnville. Both for the same woman

who had passed, Joan, a woman who had lived one of the kindest and most self-donating lives I had heard of.

It would be an honor to preside at this woman's services. Each of the family members seemed to have inherited different qualities from this matriarch whose family line was English and extended back to the time of the War of Independence. Both she and her late husband in their work life had traveled around the world and, in their retirement, had enlisted with the Oregon Coast Guard Auxiliary and were involved in water patrols of all

On the Friday night prior to the funeral, I drove over to McMinville to meet with the children of this woman, to sit and hear what stories would be told. Without this interview, whatever I produced as a reflective sermon would be minimal in its meaning at best. I wanted to hear the religious roots of this family, and the story of how they picked Zion, Pastor Chuck's church, as their church so many years before.

Her Saturday church service was packed the next day, and family members had flown and driven in from all over. I was taken by surprise by a family member who wanted me to

baptize their son prior to the funeral. I was in a quandary, as I was guest pastor for the church and the baby boy and his parents had traveled down from Idaho. I felt quite difficult about this.

Spirit seemed to whisper to me that it would be not only appropriate but advisable that a church be found in the Idaho area that would be acceptable to

the parents of the baby — and that godparents in that vicinity would be able to be fully involved in the spiritual education of the child.

It is important that a baptism be backed up with a little army of Christians who get fully involved with that child and be the charity of God to

So I shared those thoughts with those who requested this, but we did have the congregation come up to the altar and place their hands on the little boy, whose name was Lincoln. There the congregation blessed Lincoln and loved him. Lincoln will remember this. Just to reassure you, I did tell his parents that I would go to Idaho and baptize Lincoln should there be an absence of resources to do so.

In our funeral service we remembered. A slide show was shown of our subject's life and tears were shed, a lot of tears. After the first funeral service at Zion, we sat to break bread and talk between us.

The bread here was the life of our friend who had graced the church

for so many years. After this I drove down to the cemetery in McMinnville and located the plot where an urn of remains and a memorial stood for Joan, and I waited for cars to arrive of family members for a very private service, which in itself gave a permission to grieve greatly.

The next day, Sunday service also required my work — a communion, a children's sermon, and a sermon for the grown-ups (appropriately perhaps) on the parable of the prodigal son. The story of many of us, I think. I love children's sermons — everyone listens to them!

Then I turned to the grown-ups. The story of a young man who squanders his father's fortune rings a bell for many. It is the story of the unconditional love of the father, for the thoughtless rascal who doesn't understand the amazing gifts he has been given. It is both true, in that the love of God is like that for us, it is also a model for us to be as forgiving and loving as the father was in our dealings with others.

As a limey, I particularly saw myself in this story, as the young man who went to a distant land and initially struggled quite a bit. I certainly ended up repentant and contrite also. In this distant land God found me and I became a man who lives in Christ as much as I am enabled to.

God bless you, and may you learn his love the easy way, not the hard way.
