Milton-Freewater sex crimes inmate pushes for appeal of prison sentence

SALEM — Jeffrey Allen Pierce of Milton-Freewater filed a notice to appeal his sentencing on three dozen felony sex crimes. Pierce, 40, lost his case at trial in January at the Umatilla County Courthouse, Pendleton, when a jury found

him guilty on 36 counts. Circuit Judge Christopher Brauer on Feb. 2 sentenced Pierce to more than 212 years in prison. Pierce through public defender Anne Fujita Munsey of Salem filed the notice of appeal on March 5,

according to court records, with the state appellate court coordinator. Pierce is an inmate at Eastern Oregon Correctional Institution, Pendleton. His notice of appeal is the first step in the process to seek a review of the judgment.
