Alyssa Ray earned the win in the circle for Echo, allowing zero earned runs with only six hits and two walks allowed while striking out 12.

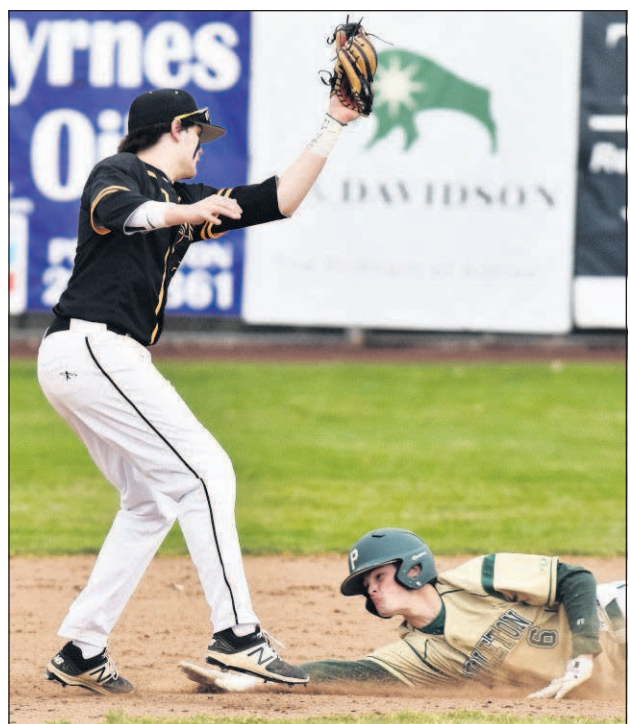
