

BMCC: Faces Wenatchee Valley next in a doubleheader

In the opener, things started well for the home Timberwolves before turning ugly late. BMCC got things going in first inning with a double by Durlflinger and a single by Rea set up a sacrifice fly to right off the bat of Broom for a 1-0 lead. But then Yakima's pitching staff settled in a kept the Timberwolves' bats quiet, while the Yaks' bats began to heat up.

The Yaks tied the game in the top of the third when Tanner Parker scored from third on a pitch that skipped away from BMCC catcher Nate Cantonwine. The Yaks then took the lead for good in the fifth inning with three runs, including an RBI single by Cole Mckenzie and an BI single by John Sage. The Yaks then added four runs in the seventh and seven runs in the eighth inning to seal it.

BMCC starting pitcher Colton Walker had a solid outing, striking out five batters in four-plus innings while walking two with two hits and one run allowed. However he was outduelled by Yakima's Matt Driver, who

punched out seven batters and allowed just four hits and one run in six innings to earn the win.

The top three in the Timberwolves' batting order combined to go 4-for-10 with one run scored, while the remaining six batters were 0-for-15 with an RBI.

Yakima's John Sage was a perfect 4-for-4 at the plate with two RBI and two runs, and Tanner Parker, Charlie Dewitt and Jake Kirchoff each had two hits. Parker also had a team-best four runs scored.

PILOT ROCK 13, JOSEPH 5 — At Pilot Rock, the visiting Joseph Eagles held a 5-2 advantage over the Pilot Rock Rockets in the fifth inning, but their lead did not last long. In the bottom of the fifth, the Rockets came alive and recorded 10 runs to take a lead they would never relinquish and turn it into a 13-5 victory.

The scoring started after two walks and a single loaded the bases allowing Tanner Corwin to advance all runners when he was hit by a pitch. Another walk and three singles kept the bases loaded adding to the Rockets advantage.

The inning was highlighted by a three-run RBI triple off the bat of Logan Weinke, and two more walks and another hit by pitch capped off the scoring for now.

Pilot Rock (5-1) held Joseph scoreless for the remainder of the game. Pierce was given the win after giving up only one run and one hit and striking out seven batters in three innings of work, and Logan Weinke threw four strong innings with four strikeouts.
