

## Officer shoots suspect in Medford

MEDFORD (AP) — A Medford police officer shot and wounded a suspect who authorities say was armed with a rifle.

Oregon State Police Lt. Mark Duncan says officers responded Thursday to a report that 41-year-old William Shelton was menacing with a firearm at a home that included children.

A SWAT team and hostage negotiators arrived when Shelton wouldn't leave the home.

Duncan says Shelton eventually came outside, firing several shots from a rifle. A Medford police office then fired a round that hit Shelton in the upper chest.

He is expected to survive.

#### Wrong-way driver critically injured in I-5 crash

SALEM (AP) — Oregon State Police say a driver was critically injured in a wrong-way crash on Interstate 5 near Lake Oswego, and a second motorist was arrested for driving the wrong way on

the freeway in Salem. The agency says 25-year-old Sydney Lopez Martinez of Cornelius was traveling southbound in the northbound lanes early Friday when she hit the side of one semi and collided with another. She was flown to OHSU Hospital.
