

Seeing Green: Seahawks get DL help drafting Rasheem Green

RENTON, Wash. — Pete Carroll dipped back into the Southern California pipeline to fill a need on the Seattle Seahawks defensive line. Unable to make a move back into the second round for an additional pick, the Seahawks selected USC defensive end Rasheem Green with the 79th overall selection in the third-round on Friday night. Seattle’s initial selection on the second day addressed a significant need along the defensive line. Seattle was slated to have the No. 76-overall pick but traded with Pittsburgh and moved back three spots to No. 79 while also picking up an additional seventh-round selection. And much to the delight of the Seahawks, Green was still on the board. “It’s tough watching guys getting drafted that play the same position when I personally feel like I’m a bit better than them. But it is what it is.” Green said. It was a relatively quiet night for a team known for being busy with draft

moves. Seattle will now have eight picks on the final day of the draft. General manager John Schneider said there never were any reasonable options that would have allowed Seattle to get back into the second round. That included any possible deals involving safety Earl Thomas, who was the source of trade speculation as his current contract expires after the 2018 season and he was one of the few Seattle options that could have landed a high draft pick. “You may have looked like he wasn’t going to be here but we didn’t look at it like that. That’s been a lot of speculation on your guys’ end of this thing,” Carroll said. “We’ve been counting on Earl being here the whole time.” Schneider believed Green was still available in the third round due to a knee injury suffered several years ago that likely downgraded his stock among teams. Schneider said Green was examined twice by Seattle’s doctors and was given high marks. “I’m sure he thought he was going to go higher. We like to have guys like that,” Schneider said.

CLEVELAND — Corey Kluber is tough to beat most nights. When his team hits five solo home runs, the task is even more difficult. Kluber (4-1) struck out 10 in 8 2/3 innings and the Cleveland Indians used a power barrage, including three homers in the first inning, to defeat the Seattle Mariners 6-5 on Friday night. “Obviously, the first time up the offense puts three on the board and they keep adding to it, it makes your job easier,” Kluber said. “You have a cushion to work with.” Kluber reached double figures in strikeouts for the 41st time and avenged his only loss this season, when Nelson Cruz hit a two-run homer at Seattle on opening day in the Mariners’ 2-1 win. The reigning AL Cy Young Award winner left with a 6-2 lead after Kyle Seager’s two-out single in the ninth, the Mariners’ fourth hit. Francisco Lindor, Michael Brantley and Edwin Encarnacion homered in the first, and Yonder Alonso and Yan Gomes hit consecutive drives in the sixth for a 6-0 lead against Erasmo Ramirez (0-2), who made his second start this season. “I wanted to get on base, get the team going and find a way

to help Kluber,” Lindor said. “I drove the ball and it went out.” Seattle manager Scott Servais knew early on that his team had a difficult task. “The story of the game was Kluber being real good again,” he said. “When you’re down 3-0 out of the chute against him, it’s tough.” Brantley added a sacrifice fly in the third and hit the Indians’ first triple this season in the fifth. Brantley and Lindor each had three hits. Cody Allen gave up Mitch Haniger’s single and Mike Zunino’s three-run homer, then retired Ben Gamel on a lineout to Lindor. Indians manager Terry

seven home runs in 9 2/3 innings. “These guys don’t mess around,” he said. “The bad news was their hits were way gone. All the pitches I threw down, they got.” On a night when the start was delayed by rain for 10 minutes, the Indians hit three homers in the first inning for the first time since Carlos Santana, Kipnis and Lonnie Chisenhall connected against the New York Yankees’ Chad Green on July 8, 2016.
