Betty Anne Christman, 81, of Lexington, Ore., died on April 27, 2018, at Chaplaincy Hospice Home in Kennewick, Wash., following a brief illness.

Betty was born in Baker City, Oregon, on Jan. 23, 1937, to Archie and Genevieve Saling. Most of Betty’s childhood was spent in North Powder, Oregon, where she attended school. Being an only child, Betty said her animals were her closest friends and she loved to pack a lunch, saddle her horse, Wildfire, and spend the day in the mountains with her dog, Patti, following beside. She had fond memories of helping her parents work a local postal route, even delivering some of the mail by horse. She immensely enjoyed the long cattle drives she took with her father from time to time as a young teenager.

Betty met Cedric (Sid) Carl Christman in high school and they married in 1954 in Weiser, Idaho. They lived in North Powder, Dayville and Hardman, Oregon, before their final landing in Lexington, Oregon. Early in their marriage Betty was a stay-at-home mom and Sid was a logger. They enjoyed camping and fishing with their three children in the mountains where Sid worked. Tragically, Sid was killed in a logging accident near Dale, Ore., in 1975.

Betty was the head cook at Heppner Grade School for many years and after retirement she did part-time janitorial work for Columbia Basin Electric Co-Op. She enjoyed traveling and spent several summers in the early 2000s traveling with Sharon Woodside to every capital city in the U.S. Betty was an excellent cook and baker and could put out a spread like no other. She entered many baking contests and won the Wheat League Cake contest several times, and made many home-cooked meals for those in need.

She enjoyed crafting and sewing and co-founded the Lady Bugs crafting group with some of her closest friends, and later, Creative Memories with Lorene Montgomery, who sold items at the local bazaars for many years. Betty was a wonderful quilter and over the years she made dozens of quilts for family, friends, and high school graduates.

Betty loved all things grandchildren and spent many years watching her grand- and great-grandchildren perform in concerts, recitals, and sporting events in Heppner, Ione, and all over the Northwest. Betty was also an avid golfer and member of Willow Creek Country Club. After all those years of being on her feet, Betty appreciated foot rubs more than anything else.

Betty was preceded in death by her parents, Archie and Genevieve Saling, and husband Cedric. She is survived by her daughter and son-in-law Joan and Scott McDaniel of Heppner; Daughter and son-in-law Jean and Marv West of Star, Idaho; and son and daughter-in-law Carl and Kelly Christman of Ione. 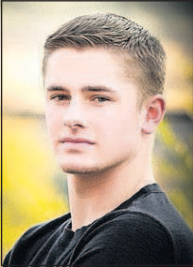
