STATEMENT OF CHANGES IN ACTIVITIES and SOURCES OF FINANCING *			
The City will increase the water rates by 7% (\$1.50 to residential users), as part of the incremental increases to meet rising costs associated with the operation and maintenance of the water system. The Public Safety Surcharge ordinance of 2010 provided for a \$6.00 monthly surcharge to assist in funding a three man police department. With the police department now fully staffed the surcharge will be increased from \$4.50 to \$6.00 to fully fund this department. Increases to personal services reflect an increase in medical insurance costs, PERS as well as a 3% wage increase.
