# Cisneros makes history for Vikings

One month ago, Hermiston native Alex Cisneros made history for the Portland State Vikings’ track and field team, breaking a 34-year-old school record time in the 10,000 meters.

This week Cisneros made history yet again for the Vikings, becoming the first men’s athlete to qualify for the NCAA West Regional Preliminary Rounds in the 10,000 meters. In fact, Cisneros is the first Viking man to qualify in an event longer than 800 meters.

Cisneros will head to Sacramento, California, next week to compete at the preliminary rounds on May 24-26 for a chance to advance to the NCAA National Championships.

His performance headlines our latest college spotlight for the week of May 9-15.

Here is a look at the rest of the week’s best performances:

• **Donte Robinson (Pendleton)**, Portland State track and field — At the Big Sky Conference Outdoor Championships, Robinson wrapped up the conference’s men’s decathlon championship, becoming the first Viking athlete to sweep the conference’s heptathlon (indoor season) and decathlon (outdoor) in the same season. To vault himself to the title, Robinson set a new personal best in the 110-meter hurdles (14.89 seconds) and beat his personal best in javelin by more than 20 feet (203-08). Unfortunately,

nately, Robinson’s season points total of 7,307 was 168 points short of the qualifying line for the NCAA Championships.

• **Nychal Gritz (Hermiston)**, Blue Mountain CC baseball — Gritz threw a complete game with nine strikeouts and only four runs allowed as BMCC defeated Big Bend CC 6-4 on May 11. Gritz ends the season with a 7-2 record and 3.74 ERA with 70 strikeouts in 81 2/3 innings.

• **RJ Robles (Hermiston)**, Treasure Valley CC baseball — On May 9, Robles helped Treasure Valley knock off BMCC 8-7 after pitching seven innings with only one earned run allowed. He finishes the season with a 3-6 record and a 3.06 ERA over 16 appearances.

• **Devon Roe (Pendleton)**, Walla Walla CC baseball — In the season’s final two doubleheaders, Roe went 5-for-11 (.454) at the plate with a double, three RBI and a run scored against Spokane and Yakima Valley. Roe ends his first season in Walla Walla with a .233

average, 1 home run and seven RBI in 24 games.

• **Hailey Kline (Pendleton)**, Eastern Oregon softball — Kline saw her collegiate career come to a close as EOU was bounced with two straight losses in the NAIA National Championships on May 14 and 15. In both losses, Kline threw 13 innings and struck out 15, while allowing only five runs.

• **Mikayla Kopacz (Hermiston)**, Columbia Basin softball — Kopacz continued to be a tough out as she went 5-for-6 with a double, five RBI and three runs scored as her CBC team split a doubleheader with BMCC on May 11.

• **Bekah Roe (Pilot Rock)**, Mt. Hood CC softball — Roe helped Mt. Hood end the regular season with a pair of wins over Chemeketa CC on May 11, going 3-for-7 (.428) with two RBI.

• **Tehya Dominguez (Pilot Rock)**, Blue Mountain CC softball — Dominguez picked up her first collegiate pitching victory in a doubleheader against Columbia Basin, throwing seven innings with two strikeouts and six runs allowed. Dominguez also added two hits with two RBI and a run scored as a hitter.

• **Doc Porter (Pendleton)**, Central Washington track and field — At the Greater Northwest Athletic Conference outdoor championships, Porter helped CWU’s 4x400 relay team to a second-place finish (3:15.03) and finished fifth individually in the 400-meter dash (49.64).

# Tigers put together late rally for 3-2 win over M’s

SEATTLE — Jose Iglesias’ two-out, two-run single in the eighth inning gave Detroit the lead, and Tigers’ pitchers allowed just two hits over the final six innings in a 3-2 win over the Seattle Mariners on Thursday night.

Detroit rallied against Seattle’s bullpen and specifically eighth-inning regular Nick Vincent (1-1) to take the opener of the four-game series. With two outs in the eighth, Vincent allowed a single to Mikie Mahtook and walked James McCann to load the bases. Seattle stayed with Vincent and Iglesias got enough of a 1-0 cutter to send it up the middle and off the glove of shortstop Jean Segura diving to try and stop the grounder.

The rally by Detroit came

an inning after Seattle failed to add to its lead after having runners at second and third with one out. Dee Gordon struck out and Segura grounded out, ending Seattle’s only scoring opportunity

after the third inning. Detroit starter Matthew Boyd struck out a career-high nine and didn’t factor in the decision but was part of a solid night by the Tigers’ staff.

# BMCC hires Hillmick as women’s soccer coach

Jordan Hillmick is coming back home.

The Pendleton native and 2012 alumnus of Pendleton High School was announced as the new head women’s soccer coach for Blue Mountain Community College, effective May 16. Hillmick replaces departed coach Art Mota, who helped start the BMCC women’s soccer program in 2016.

“I’m excited to be back in my hometown and to help grow the game,” Hill-

mick said in a press release. “But most importantly, I’m excited to help young student-athletes move on to the next level and accomplish their academic goals.”

After graduating from Pendleton High, Hillmick attended Eastern Oregon University where he spent time as a reserve goalkeeper on the men’s soccer team and as a student assistant coach for the team. After graduating from EOU last year, Hillmick stayed on campus and was hired as an assistant coach for both men’s and

women’s soccer programs.

“Coach Hillmick brings a fresh start to BMCC women’s soccer, and we’re excited to see how he helps shape the program and our players moving into next season,” said Dawn DiFuria McClendon, BMCC Director of Student Outreach, Leadership & Athletics, in the release.

The women’s program has had its struggles through two seasons of competition, went 0-14 during the 2017 season and were outscored 138-1.
