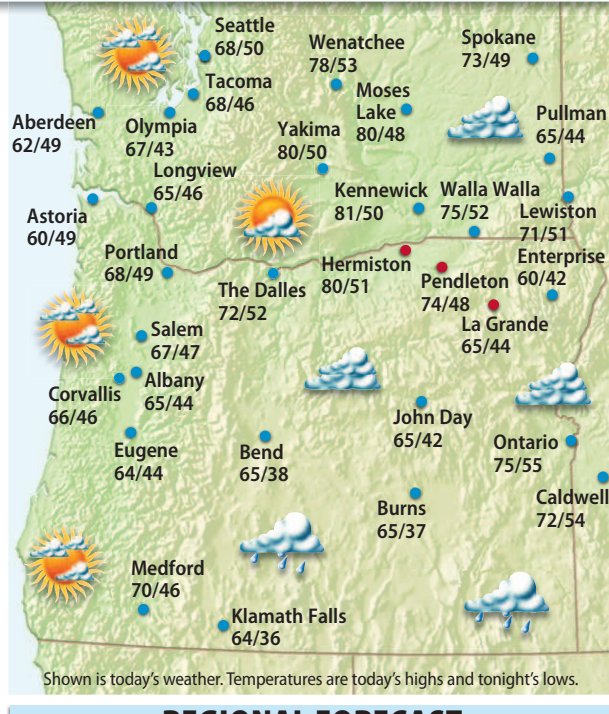

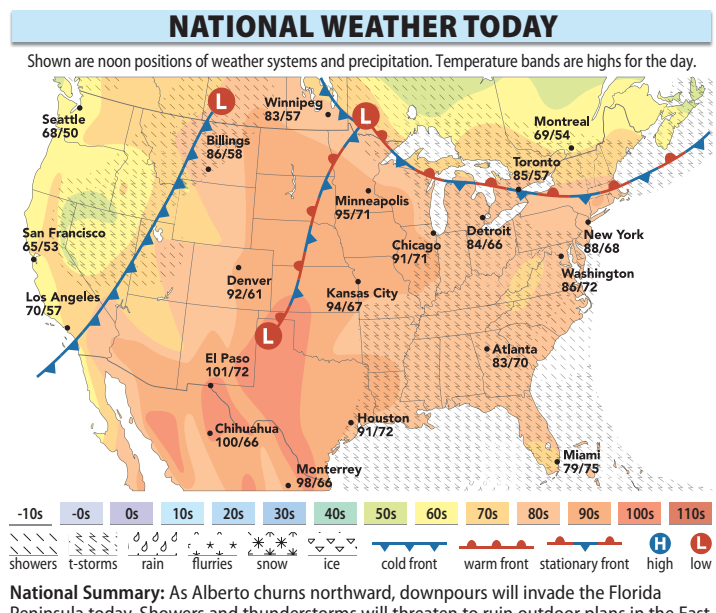

Bend population closes in on 100,000

BEND (AP) — Fast-growing Bend is nearing 100,000 people. A new estimate from the U.S. Census Bureau shows Bend's population increased 4.3 percent between July 1, 2016, and July 1, 2017, with 94,520 people now calling it home. Damian Syrnky is a senior planner in Bend's growth management department. He tells *The Bulletin* newspaper that the city is projected to have nearly 110,000 people by 2025. Bend had only 20,000 residents in 1990.

Drought emergency declared in Harney

SALEM (AP) — Oregon Gov. Kate Brown has declared a drought emergency in Harney County. *The Capital Press* reports it's the third drought declaration the governor has made so far this year, following ones for Klamath and Grant counties.

The U.S. Drought Monitor indicates nearly all of south-east Oregon has moderate to severe drought. Winter snowpack has completely vanished in the Harney Basin, and is rapidly diminishing across the rest of the state. The drought declarations allow increased flexibility in how water is managed to ensure that limited supplies are used as efficiently as possible. They also position farmers and ranchers in the county for federal help.

Officers kill bear near apartment complex

GRESHAM (AP) — Police killed a small bear that was roaming near an apartment complex in Gresham, Oregon. Gresham police told KOIN-TV there were reports of a bear Thursday. Another report around midnight indicated the animal had moved further into town. It was killed early Friday. Police said they had no choice because the bear was in a residential area.

Driver rams into 3 on Portland sidewalk

One woman was critically injured

PORTLAND — A driver rammed into three women walking on a sidewalk Friday in downtown Portland, critically injuring one of them, before speeding away and getting arrested within hours of the crash.

Someone called 911 after spotting a blue SUV that matched the description of the vehicle that struck the women near a light-rail station close to Portland State University, police Sgt. Pete Simpson said.

Police have not yet determined a motive and know little about the man, who was cooperative during his arrest, Simpson said. Authorities said they were getting a search warrant to seize the car with a crumpled hood and have yet to rule out intoxication, mental health problems or a medical incident as the reason for the crash.

The names of the suspect and victims have not been released.

Sgt. Chris Burley said one victim was in critical condition at a hospital and another was in serious condition. The family of the third woman asked that no updates be given about her health. Police have not said how fast the 2005 Mazda Tribute was traveling or how long it spent on the sidewalk traveling about 45 mph. Bond said he turned to help, and the driver "gunned it," nearly hitting him. Police cordoned off several blocks around the crash. A green sweater, a pair of sneakers, a pink slipper and one black bike glove lay scattered on the sidewalk near a small splash of blood. The crash stunned the city on the Friday before Memorial Day. On that Friday last year, a passenger fatally stabbed two men and wounded a third on a light-rail train as it pulled into a station. Police said the man spewed hateful comments at two black girls shortly before the attack.
