Sunrise Vegetation and Fuels Management Project

The draft environmental impact statement (DEIS) for the Sunrise Vegetation and Fuels Management Project is now available for public review and comment. Proposed activities include: commercial harvest, thinning, prescribed burning, regeneration tree planting, transportation system management, and danger tree removal.

This project planning area is approximately 33,150 acres in size, approximately 32,000 acres of which are National Forest System Lands within Asotin and Garfield Counties, Washington.

The DEIS analyzes the environmental consequences of the no action alternative (Alternative A), the proposed action (Alternative B), and one additional action alternative (Alternative C) was developed in response to wildlife needs. This project is subject to comment pursuant to 36 CFR 218, Subparts A and B. Only those who submit timely and specific written comments regarding the proposed project or activity during a public comment period established by the responsible official are eligible to file an objection. In order to be eligible to object, individuals or representatives of an entity submitting comments must either sign the comments or verify identity upon request.

The Forest Service will accept comments on this proposal for 45 days following the publication of the Notice of Availability in the Federal Register, which is the exclusive means for calculating the comment period. Commenters should not rely upon dates or timeframe information provided by any other source. It is the commenter's responsibility to ensure timely receipt of comments (36 CFR 218.25).

Request for Comment Class 3 Permit Modification Request for Incorporation of the Organic Recovery Unit 2 Tanks into the Chemical Waste Management of the Northwest Hazardous Waste Permit ORD 089 452 353

On October 23, 2015, Chemical Waste Management of the Northwest, Inc. (CWMNW) submitted a Class 3 Permit Modification Request (PMR) to install and operate a second Organic Recovery Unit (ORU-2) to treat and recycle hazardous waste at their facility in Arlington, OR.

After several iterations, the final scope on the Class 3 PMR was to operate the ORU-2 as a recycling unit and incorporate 22 new permitted hazardous waste tanks into the permit. Changes were made to the Inspection Plan (Standalone Document 3) and the Closure/Post-Closure Plan (Standalone Document 5). New Standalone Document 22 was added to include the operational parameters of the ORU-2 as a recycling unit and new Standalone Document 23 was added containing the design and operation information for the new tank system.

The Department has conducted a thorough review of the information provided in this Class 3 PMR and is prepared to issue tentative decision to approve this PMR. As part of the Class 3 permit modification process, the Department will open a 45 day public comment period on this draft PMR beginning June 1, 2018 and ending July 16, 2018.

The 2018-2019 approved budget totals \$99,853,986, which represents an increase of \$4.35M over the 2017-2018 adopted budget, as amended. Included in these figures is the General Fund budgeted at \$66.69M, which has increased 4.58% over the prior year. This increase of the General Fund stems primarily from projected growth in ADMw, and the utilization of reserve funds.
