Bucks' parade set for today at 5 p.m.

PENDLETON — On Saturday morning, the Pendleton softball team thumped the Putnam Kingsmen by a 7-0 score to capture the Class 5A state championship at the Oregon State University Softball Complex. Numerous Pendleton fans made the four-plus hour trip to Corvallis to witness the title in person, but those fans that missed out have a chance to celebrate with the team Wednesday afternoon.

Beginning at 5 p.m., the softball team will load up on top of the Happy Canyon van and parade through Pendleton before ending at Dave's Chevron, 220 S.W. 12th St. The team will travel through the usual parade route in town, down Main Street and then down Court Avenue. After the parade, the team will stop at Dave's Chevron for a meet-and-greet as well as free ice cream for all that attend, paid for by the Buckaroo Boosters.

in Columbia River Conference play, and earning three straight trips to the state playoffs.

"Pendleton's been amazing," Tedder said. "I couldn't ask for a better place to start my career with the opportunity to coach and teach at a big school."

The 2016-17 season was the Buckaroos' best under Tedder, as they went 17-5 overall and 9-0 in the conference and earned a berth to the state tournament in Corvallis. There, the Buckaroos bounced back from a loss in the quarterfinals to defeat Crescent Valley and Summit to earn the fourth place finish and bring home the school's first state trophy since the 1959 season.

Tedder said it was extremely difficult to leave the Buckaroos, especially prior to the upcoming 2018-19 season, as the team is primed for another solid run next season with

seniors Tyler Newsom and Willie Camp and sophomore sharpshooter Dakota Sams.

"The hardest conversation to have was with them," Tedder said. "To look at those guys knowing they're going to have an amazing year, that was tough. The competitor in me wanted to stay and go win league again and go back to state."

Next season at North Medford, a Class 6A school, Tedder says he will be taking a step back in his coaching role and will be an assistant in some capacity with the Black Tornadoes. And while he admits it will be tough to give up the reins of being the head coach, he's looking forward to this next step.

"I'm so excited," Tedder said. "I'm looking forward to this."

in the country behind me and I definitely used that today, especially Kwan," said OSU Sunday starter Kevin Abel, who tipped his cap to the junior after the highlight catch. "He was running all over the yard." Bryce Fehmel, Heimlich and Abel all turned in quality starts at the Corvallis Regional.

Fehmel went 7½ innings in Friday's 9-3 victory over Northwestern State, giving up two earned runs with a season-high nine strikeouts. The junior right-hander is 5-0 in his last five starts.

In Saturday's matchup with LSU ace Zack Hess, Heimlich didn't have his

usual command but still grinded out seven innings of one-run ball. The two-time Pac-12 pitcher of the year walked four and hit two batters.

Heimlich, a senior lefty, has won eight straight starts and leads Division I with 15 victories, a single-season school record.

Abel had the best outing of the weekend, scattering three hits in eight-plus shutout innings as OSU clinched the regional. The freshman righty struck out eight and issued just one walk.

After the regional, Mainieri called OSU a team "without a weakness." The Beavers certainly had the look of a national title contender last weekend.
