**Crow's Shadow welcomes artist**

MISSION — Splitting her time between her hometown of New Delhi, India, and her home of Portland, Avantika Bawa is currently participating in a two-week print residency at Crow's Shadow Institute of the Arts.

The public is invited to an Artist Talk, where Bawa will discuss her work. The free event is Friday from 5-7 p.m. at 48004 Saint Andrew's Road, Mission.

Bawa is working on developing limited-edition prints, which will be hand-pulled in collaboration with Judith Baumann, Crow's Shadow master printer.

Most artists-in-residence at Crow's Shadow create two images for editioning, which is typically completed in the following months. Upon completion, the prints will be available for sale and one copy of each edition will enter the institute's permanent collection.

Bawa is the first of three 2018 Golden Spot Residency Award winners at Crow's Shadow this year. Generously supported by the Ford Family Foundation, the program invites Oregon-based contemporary artists to the studio to work in a new medium.

Their troubles, though great and deep, are seen in a larger perspective of society, history, landscape, that admits sympathy but not self-pity, and lets us share both their pain and their hope."

Although it has been 54 years since Hodaka trail bikes and motorcycles were manufactured in Athena, Hodaka and vintage motorcycles enthusiasts will make their annual pilgrimage to Eastern Oregon.

Athena City Park serves as celebration central during Hodaka Days, which revs up Thursday through Sunday. In addition, activities are held in multiple venues in Athena and Weston.

To kick things off, there's a vintage bike Poker Run "TT ride" Thursday at 2 p.m., departing from Weston. A riders meeting takes place at 1:30 p.m. Participants will embark several miles out on paved back roads. It's open to all vintage bikes up to 250 cc. The participation fee is \$25 (\$20 for club members) and people do not have to register in advance. An ice cream social closes out the evening from 7-9 p.m. at the Swanson residence, 424 E. College St.,

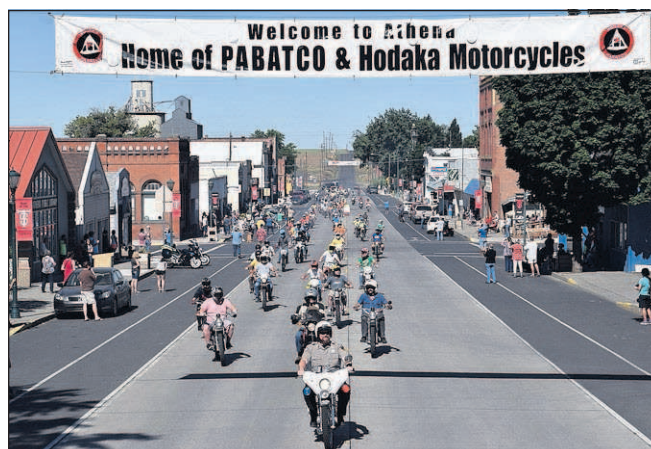

Pre-registration is required for the Bad Rock Reunion Trail Ride, which is Friday at 10 a.m. (riders meeting at 9:30 a.m.). It offers participants a chance to ride some of the back country and actual trails used during the famous Bad Rock ISDT qualifiers of the 1970s. The 50-mile course

takes off from Perrine Farm, 78573 McLean Road, about a quarter mile south of Weston.

The Swap Meet and Hodaka Club Tent will be open Friday from noon to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the park. Also, a silent auction and sale runs Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Available for purchase

and up for bid are Hodaka parts and services, tools, riding gear, as well as some unique one-of-a-kind items and Hodaka Days T-shirts. Also, Rhonda's Chuck Wagon will be on hand throughout the weekend offering food and beverage service.

A parade is planned Saturday at 1 p.m. on Athena's Main Street. A bike show runs from 2:30-4:30 p.m. (registration opens at 11 a.m.).

The banquet dinner is Saturday at 6:30 p.m. at Athena Elementary School. The awards presentation and special auction follows from 7:30-9 p.m. Dinner tickets, which are \$12, must be purchased in advance.

The event concludes with Sunday's Open Track Time from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Diamond Eye Track. Amateurs and experts are welcome. The cost is \$25 or \$20 for Hodaka members.
