Dennis Lowell Tyler, 75, of Enterprise, Oregon, died June 4, 2018. Born August 10, 1942, to Grant Lowell and Eva Louise (Larson) Tyler, he joined brother Jim. The family moved to Buhl, Idaho, shortly after, then to Pendleton, Oregon, where Dennis graduated from Pendleton High School in 1960.

An outstanding athlete, Dennis was a repeat letterman in football, track, and basketball; as quarterback, he led the Bucks to the Intermountain Conference Championship in 1959.

After graduation, Dennis attended his freshman year at the University of Washington and played quarterback for the Huskies.

He then transferred to Boise State, continuing his football career and graduating with a degree in education.

Dennis accepted his first teaching position out of college at Joseph High School in Joseph, Oregon, where he taught until retiring in 2000, continuing to substitute teach in local schools into 2007.

He then married Sharon Cone in 1964 and had two sons, Eric and Kirk. In 1995, Dennis married Kathleen ("Kit") Chase, adding Kit's daughter Andrea to the family.

Dennis enjoyed fishing, biking, and in his fifties took up golf, which he pursued with zeal.

His love of science, math and sports was evident both in the classroom — teaching biology, algebra, math, personal finance, mechanical drawing, and physical education — as well as on the field and mat. Dennis is especially known as JoHi's

wrestling coach, a role he served with distinction from 1968-1989 and returned to in 1991 for a few more years. Under Dennis' tenure, the Eagles were district champions several times and turned out numerous state champion wrestlers, including both sons, Eric and Kirk. Dennis also served as head football coach and athletic director during his career at JHS. As passionate as he was about sports, Dennis desired his athletes and students to achieve their best in the classroom.

An active member of Enterprise Christian Church, Dennis served as Deacon, Sunday School teacher, and Bible study leader. Dennis was dedicated to his family and especially to his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

A devoted husband, father, and grandfather, Dennis is survived by his wife Kit, of Enterprise; Eric (son) and JoAnn Tyler of Little Elm, Texas, and grandchildren Sydney (18), Jake (15) and Peyton (13); Kirk (son) and Kimberly Tyler, grandson Kashton (3) of Denton, Texas, and granddaughter Kylee (14) of Great Falls, Montana; Andrea Tyler (daughter) and grandson Alex (22) of Newberg, Oregon; and Jim Tyler (brother) of Seattle.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Lowell and Eva.
