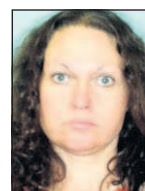

Campfires, open flames banned at all state parks

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon has banned campfires and open flames at all state parks following Gov. Kate Brown's wildfire emergency declaration this week. *The Oregonian/Oregon-*

Live reports the state Parks and Recreation Department announced the ban Thursday that applies to wood, charcoal and other open flame sources that are not controlled with a valve.

Officials expect the ban to last a week, but the period will depend on weather and input from fire officials.
