Ben and Nora Lee were married June 11, 1955, and had four children, Pam (deceased), Vicki, Robyn and Chris. She took several years off from teaching to raise her four children and then returned as a teacher in Helix when her children were all in school. She taught for over 17 years before retiring.

Nora Lee and Ben enjoyed traveling and they had the opportunity to visit many countries, including her favorite, China, twice.

Nora Lee was also very active in her community. She was an avid bridge player, a member of Tea at Two (TAT), a past president of the local chapter of the Del-

phian Society, a past president of Pendleton Country Club's Women's Board, and led a women's investment club in Pendleton for several years. She loved volunteering at the Umatilla County Historical Society and its thrift store, and for the Pendleton Art Center. She was an avid supporter of the arts, often hosting home stays for guest musicians for the Eastern Oregon symphony. She and her husband Ben golfed, and were members of a Great Decisions Group and Killkare. She was a life-long member of the Catholic Church, attending St Mary's church and later St. Andrew's parish in Mission.

Nora Lee is survived by her husband Ben Holdman; two brothers, Mike and Tim Temple; daughters Vicki Kimbrel and Robyn Holdman; son Chris Holdman; two sons-in-law, John Dunlap and Dan Cavagnaro; daughter-in-law Katy Holdman; and eight grandchildren.
