Pendleton woman wins Keno jackpot

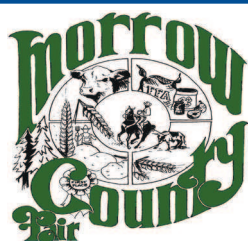
PENDLETON — Enola Dick of Pendleton hit the Keno jackpot recently, scoring \$66,576.

Dick purchased the ticket at Cadillac Jack's Saloon and Grill in Pendleton, but told lottery officials she didn't stick around for the drawing but instead went home to do laundry.

The payday was a combination of the \$25,000 prize for matching all eight numbers and \$41,576 for the rolling jackpot, which builds over time.

Dick said in a news release she had been planning to go to Hawaii for a while, and now might be the right time — once Hurricane Hector passes.

According to the Oregon Lottery, during the 2015-17 biennium in Umatilla County more than \$16 million in Oregon Lottery proceeds were directed to economic development, parks, education and watershed enhancement.

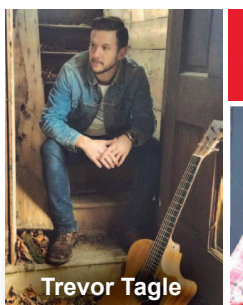

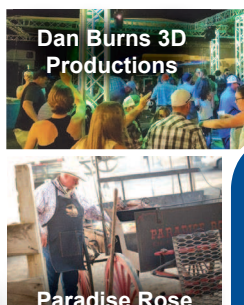
