Nancy Carolina Doherty, age 82, passed away peacefully next to the love of her life, Eddie, on Tuesday, October 9, 2018, at her home in Milton-Freewater, Oregon.

Nancy was born on December 2, 1935, in Pendleton, Oregon. She was the eighth of nine children. Her parents, Florence and John Swanson, taught their children the gift of family, charity, and storytelling. Nancy was the Homecoming queen, Miss Congeniality, and a can-can dancer for Happy Canyon. She graduated in 1954 from Pendleton High School and attended Gonzaga University, Eastern Oregon State College, and graduated with a B.S. in Education from Portland State University.

She met the man with whom she would spend the rest of her life, "Eddie," Ed Doherty, in 1955 at Lehman Hot Springs. Their love continued to grow and they were married in 1961 in Pendleton, Ore. Nancy and Eddie moved from Pilot Rock to Milton-Freewater with their first five children in 1966.

Nancy began teaching for the school district and had three more children. She continued her love of teaching for the next 35 years. Nancy worked to give every student a chance and was especially fond of the shy students. She wanted every child to feel heard, loved, and have a sense of belonging.

Nancy was especially passionate about Oregon Trail history and serving her community. She served the St. Francis Catholic Church and St. Jude's. She was the Eucharistic minister for the homebound and assisted living residents for her parish. She devoted countless hours to providing communion, liturgy, friendship, and positivity to those in need. She also gave time to Special Olympics, Frazer Farmstead Museum, restoring and maintaining the Pioneer Cemetery and being the Milton-Freewater historian. Nancy has been described as an "angel on Earth" and an "indomitable force of nature." This year, she was recognized with the Golden Pioneer Award for her lifetime of community service.

Her love for Eddie and their family — Art (Sandy), Lisa (Tim), Kim (Joe), Hoot (Ann), Go-Go (Ted), Shawn (Nathalie), Tim (Stephanie) and Heather (Brian) — filled her soul. She enjoyed many memorable family gatherings, parties, and trips to their cabin at Lehman Hot Springs (where they met and fell in love). Their children provided opportunity to travel all over the world, from South Africa to Ireland, Japan and Italy. When friends

would visit the Doherty house, Nancy would always say, "Welcome to the loud house!" because it was filled with love, joy and unending laughter.

Nancy's heart grew exponentially with the addition of 15 grandchildren (Blake, Jessica, Sarah, Ashley, Alex, Nicky, Mikey, Eddie, Dallas, Elsie, Dylan, Emme, Francis, Liam and Charlie) and two great-grandchildren (Annabelle and Hadley).

Nancy was proud and overjoyed to spend time with the next Doherty generation. They would plan and perform plays, listen to grandma tell stories, go on rock collecting adventures, and she even taught them how to gamble! Her grandchildren absolutely adored their "Grandma Doherty, Dub Dub, Grandma Jesus." Her kind and gracious spirit will be missed immensely in our family and throughout the community.

In remembering her, Nancy would want people to smile, give to someone who is in need, spend time with and listen to a child, love your family, laugh, dance, sing and as she always ended every conversation ... "Trust Jesus."

Your mother is always with you. She's the whisper of the leaves as you walk down the street, she's the smell of certain foods you remember, flowers you pick, the fragrance of life itself. She's the cool hand on your brow when you're not feeling well, she's your breath in the air on a cold winter's day. She is the sound of the rain that lulls you to sleep, the colors of a rainbow, she is Christmas morning. Your mother lives inside your laughter. She is the place you came from, your first name, your first friend, even your first enemy, but nothing on earth can separate you. Not time, not space ... not even death.

The celebration of Nancy's life begins Wednesday, October 17 at 7 p.m. for the rosary at Munselle-Rhodes Funeral Home in Milton-Freewater, Ore. Her mass and service will be Thursday, October 18 at 10 a.m. at St. Francis Catholic Church in Milton-Freewater, immediately followed by a luncheon in the Catholic Church social hall. Nancy will be laid to rest in Pendleton, Ore., later that day with a private family service.

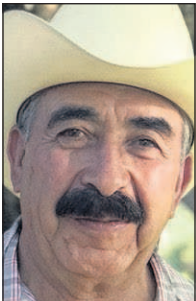
Soilo was preceded in death by his wife, Lidia Espino Garcia, and his parents.

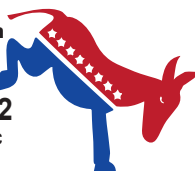
