Flugelhornist jazzes up EOU event

LA GRANDE — A jazz flugelhornist from Centralia, Washington, is serving as a visiting artist residency at Eastern Oregon University in La Grande.

Dmitri Matheny will present a workshop on the music business, work with university students and will play during an evening performance. Matheny will present "Music in the Digital Age" Thursday at noon in the EOU choir room, located in Loso Hall, and then will spend time with the EOU 45th Parallel Ensemble at 2 p.m. in Groth Recital Hall.

Winner of Instrumentalist of the Year during the recent Seattle Earshot Jazz Golden Ear Awards, Matheny will be joined in the evening from 8-10 p.m. to perform with EOU faculty Matt Cooper (piano) and Luke McKern (bass), as well as drummer Mark Emerson. The free event will be held at Ten Depot Street, La Grande. Matheny has been referred to as "one of the most emotionally expressive improvisers of his generation."
