A trooper responded to a report of someone illegally shooting the elk on Kelly Prairie in the Heppner big game unit. Multiple hunters told the trooper they shot at a bull elk but no one admitted to shooting the cow. The group of hunters estimated firing 20-25 rounds.

After talking with numerous people, the trooper could not determine who shot the elk. He salvaged the carcass and dropped it off at Eastern Oregon Mobile Slaughter, Hermiston.

10:38 a.m. - Emergency personnel rescued a Weston man after he crashed on Weston Mountain.

William James Wondra, 75, was heading west on Highway 204 in a Ford Ranger when the pickup left the right side of the road near mile point 3.3, according to Oregon State Police, and struck a guardrail. The pickup then rolled down the steep embankment but landed upright.

State police also reported Wondra was injured and in pain, and an emergency aircraft flew him to Providence St. Marry Medical Center, Walla Walla.

2:01 p.m. - An Oregon State Police trooper stopped a dark gray Subaru Outback heading east on Interstate 84 near milepost 178 for lacking plates or a temporary permit. A white female was driving and she had a white male passenger. But before the trooper could learn much more, the driver took off.

The driver exceeded 120 mph in fleeing the cop and used the right shoulder to pass other vehicles. The car took the exit at milepost 177 to Frontage Road, continued east to County Line Road and headed into a field of crops.

State police called off the chase but searched the area to no avail. Still, the trooper noted the car had a "Tonkin.com" dealership plate and a Seattle Seahawks sticker on the center of the rear bumper.
